REFORMATION SUNDAY

Reformation Sunday is coming up on October 27. It is a festival unique to our Lutheran tradition remembering the day Martin Luther posted the 95 Theses on the door of Wittenberg Chapel. By faith alone, by grace alone, by Christ alone, by God's Word alone became the slogans arguing for reform in the Christian Church. The work of reformation continues and may the LORD reform us to be faithful and true to Him alone and not the mess of mere human religion. This is a constant communication effort. Find below notes that are given from time to time to visitors and new folks here. There may be a Scripture or two worth considering again for each of us. You may even want to get a copy of that Augsburg Confession or the whole Book of Concord for yourself! There are editions for free on-line with the websites below.

What are Lutherans?

Lutherans are Christians and are a major branch of the one, holy, Christian Church with some 80 million members worldwide. Martin Luther attempted to reform false teaching in the Roman Catholic Church. In 1517, Luther listed those reforms in the **95 Theses** and posted them for public protest and debate. This began the Protestant Reformation in Christianity.

What do Lutheran Christians believe?

The **Augsburg Confession** is the primary text for Lutheran theology, or teaching about God. Articles from this are below with Bible references included.

sons: Father, + Son, and Holy Spirit revealed in the life, death and resurrection of Jesus Christ for us (Matthew 28:19).

Original Sin: All human beings are full of sin. That is the selfishness, brokenness and distortion in our perception of reality that leads to death and damnation in separation from God (Romans 3:10-20).

The Son of God: Jesus Christ, Son of God and Son of Man, came to save us from sin, death, and devil. By His Life we receive true life both now and forever (John 1:10-13).

Justification: We are made right with God by faith through grace in Jesus Christ. For by grace you have been saved through faith, and this is not your own doing; it is the gift of God (Ephesians 2:8).

By receiving Jesus' gifts of Word and Sacraments, we grow in faith, hope, and love serving to the glory of God through our families, our work, the local church, and community. Consider learning more about Lutheran Christians at lutheranchapelchurch.org, ELCA.org, or bookofconcord.org.

LUTHERAN CHAPEL COUNCIL MINUTES SEPTEMBER 8, 2019

The next scheduled Council meeting is on Sunday, October 13, 2019 at 5:00 pm in the Conference Room.

The Council made decisions and discussed the following:

- ◆ We will welcome Chaplain Dwayne Burke on a Sunday convenient to him and the church to share his Gateway program "Loving All Our Neighbors" discussing how to help our neighbor and have healthy boundaries.
- Plans continue for the church Fall Fest on September 29th in the Picnic Pavilion immediately following the 10:30 am worship service. BBQ, Bounce houses and games—open to all ages!
- A motion unanimously passed to continue security presence on Sundays until the end of December 2019.
- ◆ A motion unanimously passed to accept bid from Fortner Landscaping to replace drain-pipe and install drain basin in affected area around parsonage to address water issues.
- Council discussed and is in agreement with Property Committee to remove gazebo from church campus due to security concerns after hours at back of church property.
- ◆ Administrative Assistant Claudia Zibell has resigned her position at Lutheran Chapel effective September 30, 2019. A reception will take place following the 10:30 worship service on Sunday, September 22 to honor Claudia. A team has been assembled to interview potential candidates for this position.
- A motion unanimously passed to approve Worship and Music Committee request to provide three meals in Fellowship Hall and services in Sanctuary for Advent Season.
- Revenues compared to expenses year to date through August 31, 2019 reflect a positive balance of \$20,056.72.

Holy Angels currently serves residents who live in a specialized community center, five intermediate care facilities for the mentally retarded and four community group homes. 


