*Rejoice always, pray without ceasing, give thanks in all circumstances:
 for this is the will of God in Christ Jesus for you. 1 Thessalonians 5:16-17*

The whole slop-closet full of mildewed performances (which is all you have to offer) is simply your death; it is Jesus who is your life. 

LUTHERAN CHAPEL
COUNCIL MINUTES
OCTOBER 13, 2019

The Council made decisions and discussed the following:

- ◆ Fred Ward presented to council the findings of the Electronic Sign Committee which researched several vendors in the local area. Cost of the sign will be around \$28k. Lutheran Brotherhood has earmarked \$2,000 towards the cost of the new sign. An upcoming temple talk is planned to review the electronic sign research and recommendations with the congregation.
- ◆ Previously reported drainage/water issue outside of the parsonage has been repaired.
- ◆ Previously reported/voted on sanctuary bell issues are currently under repair.
- ◆ Council discussed need to pave walkway area to picnic shelter for better access.
- ◆ Previously reported dedicated cable/router for sanctuary Wi-Fi for service live streaming has been completed.
- ◆ Annual soup luncheon with collection of Thanksgiving meals and Samaritan’s shoeboxes scheduled for November 3, 2019
- ◆ Church-wide Advent event scheduled for November 24, 2019
- ◆ Revenues as compared to expenses year to date through September 30, 2019 reflect a positive balance of \$21,876.22.

NOVEMBER LOVE OFFERING ~
LUMIERE MEDICAL MINISTRIES

Our November Love Offerings will be sent to Lumiere Medical Ministries. This ministry was incorporated in North Carolina in 1987 with offices in Gastonia. They provide financial assistance, long-term missionaries, procurement of supplies and equipment and a regular rotation of work teams, prayer teams, doctors and technicians to support programs and projects in Haiti. Lumiere Ministries supports:

- ◆ The Advantage Rehabilitation Program
- ◆ Community Health located in Bonne fin – volunteers and supplies
- ◆ Centre de Sante Luminere – a small hospital and dental clinic in Les Cayes
- ◆ Kings’s Organization – a hospital and orphanage in Port au Prince
- ◆ hospital de la Paix – a hospital in Port au Prince
- ◆ Jacmel Project – church, school and remote medical clinics
- ◆ Antigua Project – medical volunteers

Lumiere’s primary support is with organizations and individuals whose objectives are to proclaim the Light of the Gospel through health care, education, community development, and spiritual growth.

Half of the population of nearly 9 million in Haiti is malnourished, 4 million people lack access to clean water, and the rate of HIV/AIDS is the highest in the region. Haiti is the poorest country in the Western Hemisphere with 80% of the population living under the poverty line and 54% living in hopeless poverty. Lumiere provides the basic human needs of food and medical relief and in doing so feeds the spirit of these people so desperately in need, sharing the hope and love of Jesus Christ. Lumiere asks that we continue to pray for their ministry and prayerfully consider making a donation. Without the support they receive, they could no longer continue to provide food, sustain the medical work and share God’s love with the Haitian people. As always, thank you for your generosity and support of this ministry.

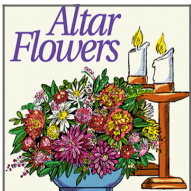

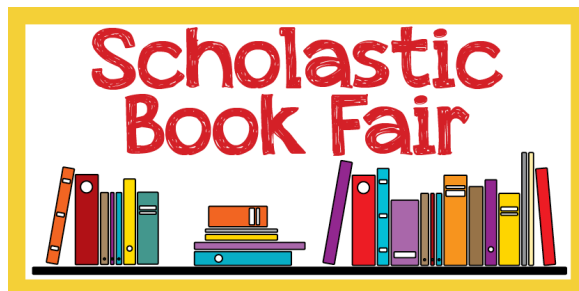

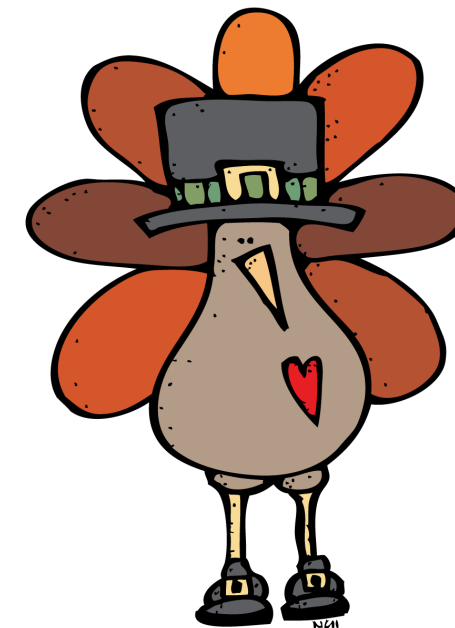

PROJECTS

Auxiliary parking lot area in front of Scout Hut

- Spread dirt in holes where 3 trees were removed.
- Spread seed, fertilizer, straw.

Picnic Pavilion, Fire Pit Area

- Remove existing pine needles and black plastic ground cover.
- Weed eat thoroughly and apply weed control.
- Replace with new black plastic ground cover.
- Spread mulch around shrubbery.

Columbarium

- Clean brick for mildew, mold, dirt.
- Remove weeds and spray weed control around entire area.

Sign On New Hope Road

- Clean brick for mildew, mold dirt.
- Trim shrubbery around sign.
- Trim overhanging limbs near sign.

Front of Scout Hut

- Cut a ditch, width of a shovel, the entire length in front of patio
- Remove dirt and replace with rock from rock pile.
- Spread additional rock back towards pavement.

Fenced in areas around air conditioning units

- Spray for weed control.

Cemetery

- Weed eat around tomb stones, foot stones, and coping.

Court Drive side of cemetery

- Cut down small growth with loppers on Court Drive.
