On Weekly Communion: The Words of Institution

The Words of Institution are found in Matthew 26:26-30, Mark 14:22-26, Luke 22:14-30, and 1 Corinthians 11:23-32. Do you think something repeated in God's Word four times might be important? Like the Ten Commandments or Lord's Prayer, these are crucially important Scriptures at the heart of the Holy Communion Service. Consider putting these words in your heart and, as an exercise during Lent, contemplate these questions.

In the night in which He was betrayed,

What did Jesus do when betrayed? What do you do when you are betrayed?

Our Lord Jesus took bread, and gave thanks; broke it, and gave it to His disciples, saying:

Are your eyes open to give thanks to God for the gift of life? For the gift of daily bread (blessings received each appointed day)? For the sacrificial love of Jesus given for you?

Take and eat; this is My Body given for you. Do this for the remembrance of Me.

Do you remember the death of Jesus for your sins? The Real Presence of Jesus is in, with, and under this bread for you as two or three gather together in His Name – are you aware of His Presence in the Holy Communion for you and for us?

Again, after supper, He took the cup, gave thanks, and gave it for all to drink, saying: This cup is the New Covenant in My Blood, shed for you and for all people for the forgiveness of sins. Do this for the remembrance of Me.

Do you remember the blood of Jesus shed for you? Are you aware of your sins (re: the Ten Commandments are a mirror to show our sins) and do you take them to Jesus that you may be forgiven? Do you live in the new covenant (re: baptismal vows) each day given?

Jesus, Lamb of God, to which all the Passover lambs pointed, is given that you may be fed, forgiven and live in the Kingdom of God forever. Receive His Word and Sacrament throughout your journey of life week by week, now and forever. Let us grow closer to Him these days of Lent 2020.

LUTHERAN CHAPEL COUNCIL MINUTES FEBRUARY 9, 2020

The council made decisions and discussed the following:

- A motion unanimously passed to welcome Andy Watson and James Daves into membership at Lutheran Chapel.
- A motion unanimously passed to cover costs of approximately \$1,800 for 9-10 confirmands and adult chaperones Amy and Josh Carpenter to attend confirmation retreat 4/24/20 – 4/26/20.
- Council discussed feedback from congregational meeting earlier in the day during which congregation voted to move forward with proposed electronic sign in cavity of existing outdoor church sign. \$11,292.73 has been raised to date for this project.
- Souper Bowl of Caring competition between Roots and Sprouts raised \$1,600+ for CAM and Salvation Army.
- Youth Sunday is scheduled for 5/17.
- New members were voted on for the Memorial (Scott Swindler/Second term), Cemetery Endowment (Fred Ward/Second term), and Endowment (James Hovis, Ed Robinson/Second term) committees.
- Communications IT team has been asked to research replacement costs for church computers which are currently operating on Windows 7.
- Lenten services scheduled for Ash Wednesday 3/4, 3/11, 3/18, 3/25 and 4/1 at 7:00pm with meal provided at 5:30pm for handbells and congregation at 6:00pm.
- Holy Week services scheduled for Maundy Thursday, 7:00pm; Good Friday, 7:00pm; Easter Vigil 7:00pm; Sunrise Easter Service, 7:30am; and Easter Service 10:30am.
- Property committee task list discussed with initial focus on repairs to motion sensor lock on inside of front door to Educational building and future agenda item discussion for Chapel redesign/ refresh.
- Revenues as compared to expenses year to date through January 31, 2020 reflect a negative balance of \$2,906.54.

The next scheduled council meeting is Sunday, March 8, 2020 at 5:00pm in the conference room.

MARCH LOVE OFFERING ~ The Cathy Mabry Cloninger Center A Domestic Violence Shelter

Our love offering for March will be sent to The Cathy Mabry Cloninger Center - A Domestic Violence Shelter. The Shelter operates under the direction of the Gaston County Department of Health and Human Resources and has been in operation since April, 1982. The Home serves as a temporary shelter for clients to work on goals to establish new housing, jobs, daycare, etc. while providing a safe, emergency residence where victims can live in times of crisis. Other services provided include counseling, court advocacy, and support group meetings for women and a children's programs. When the families leave, the staff wants them to be strong, hopeful for the future and know that there is always someone only a phone call away if help is needed.

Domestic violence statistics continue to rise, therefore it is so important for each of us to take a stand against this deadly and violent problem affecting many innocent women and children. In the United States, a woman is assaulted every nine seconds. We can all play a role in stopping violence and creating a safe environment for people to live and work. In 2019, The Shelter served 405 clients and received 1,884 calls for help and assistance. The Shelter depends on donations from private citizens, public and private organizations, local industries, and religious groups throughout the county. Please prayerfully consider giving a donation to this ministry and help to make difference.

LUTHERAN CHAPEL CHURCH MEN'S GROUP 19TH ANNUAL PINE NEEDLE SALE MARCH 7TH – MARCH 14TH



Again this year, the men of the church will be conducting our annual long leaf pine needle sale. With a lot of repeat customers and great volunteer help, we look forward to a successful sale. This year we will again be using the same North Carolina supplier offering NC (Pinehurst area) long leaf pine needles. These pine needles are hand raked and bailed. They are also known for their higher rosin content, better color and longer life. After 10 years in a row of holding our same selling price of \$4.75, our supplier has increased our cost by \$0.25/bale. Therefore our selling price this year will be \$5.00/bale. We hope you understand. We will continue to deliver 12 or more bales free.

We appreciate your purchase in the past and wanted to let you know that we will be selling and delivering beginning March 7th and continuing through March 14th. If you are interested, please complete the form enclosed in the church bulletin, call the church office @ 704-864-6491, or contact Fred Ward or Steve Clark.

Proceeds will be used to support our youth programs, youth mission trips, beautification of our church campus, and other ministries of our church. Again, thank you for your continued support.

Volunteer help to deliver pine needles would be most appreciated.


Monthly Newsletter Updates!


