The Story of Salvation

The Person of Almighty God: Father, + Son, and Holy Spirit loves persons and calls all of us to trust and walk with Him always. This is the good news in miniature (John 3:16). Recitations of the story of salvation go back to the risen Jesus (Luke 24), Peter (Acts 2), Stephen (Acts 7) and Paul (Acts 13) and depict how the Law, the Prophets and the Writings climax in the Gospels with the Life of Jesus to save our lives then to the mission of the Christian Church to the Last Day. So, from Genesis to Revelation, God's story of which our story is an unfolding part, this is all meant for us but are we getting it?

The plan is to start on Sunday, September 13 and over the course of the year go text by text, book by book on a thematic exploration of the whole story of salvation. Preferably we could read the entire Bible together verse by verse. But you may have noticed the Bible is a pretty big collection of writings! Hopefully each of us adult disciples use **Our Daily Bread** for daily prayer and there the discipline is offered to read the Bible in a year verse by verse. Nevertheless, on Sundays, Service by Service, we can focus on a significant number of stories and teachings that will guide us through the story of salvation in the Scriptures.

As we go on this shared discipline we may learn and sing the great biblical canticles. We may watch some of the great movies based on biblical stories together or at least share as recommendations. Yes, that will include everything from **The Ten Commandments** made

in 1956 to the **Gospel of John** made in 2014 and many, many more. We may use these selections for specific Bible study as well, either together or individually.

May our Father in Heaven bless this discipline to read the Scriptures from Genesis to Revelation. May our Father in Heaven grow us in understanding of the Word and of His ever-present grace and love.

Guidelines for In-Person Worship

The Gathering

Main exterior entrance doors will be utilized and will be kept open during the service. Handicap entrance available on an as needed basis.

Hand sanitizer will be available in the narthex of the Sanctuary Sunday by Sunday.

Covid-19 warnings will be posted from the Center for Disease Control throughout the church campus.

Registry of attendance will be kept of all who gather with contact information for the purpose of contact tracing if someone infected unknowingly attends worship.

Printed bulletins will be distributed to pews (hymnals removed).

Social distancing seating will be marked on pews.

Ushers will assist with seating/dismissal.

Acolyte and Crucifer volunteer duties will not take place at this time.

Facemasks are required per state mandate. A group of volunteers made/distributed masks to members. If you are still in need of one, please contact the Pastor or the church office. Masks will also be onhand for visitors.

Restrooms will be designated ONE PERSON at a time, with the exception of parents with children and disabled persons requiring assistance. Disinfectant spray will be available.

Disinfectant spray and paper towels will be available at the end of each pew. Please use this to wipe down pew seats, seat backs and kneelers.

Balcony closed for use by streaming team only.

On Singing the Service and Sacred Song

Subdued singing of the Service and sacred song is encouraged as singing has been shown to lead to the spread of COVID-19. Subdued singing includes use of the mask with singing while seated.

The Sharing of the Peace

Sharing of the peace will be *verbal* going forward between the presider and the gathered congregation.

The Offering

Tithes and offerings will be received in *the offering plates located in the Narthex* by our ushers at the end of the Service.

Administration of the Sacrament

- *The distribution of Holy Communion and an individual blessing for dismissal will be at the end of the Service.* Receiving lines will not be held.
- Presiding and assisting ministers handling communion will *publicly sanitize their hands* and wear *surgical gloves* to administer communion.
- The congregation will be asked to have their hands open so that the bread can be *dropped* into their hands.
- Waste baskets will be placed at the foot of both sides and at the bottom of the steps for disciples to discard their communion cups, thus keeping contamination out of the trays.

Exit the church immediately after receiving Holy Communion maintaining social distancing protocols.

LUTHERAN CHAPEL COUNCIL MINUTES AUGUST 9, 2020

The council made decisions and discussed the following:

- Discussed and voted to resume the Early Worship Service beginning September 13.
- The return to in-person Sunday School will be discussed after initial information is available following the start of the school year.
- Discussed the beginning of youth activities:
 - o Sprouts will resume virtual meetings on the first and third Wednesdays of the month beginning in September.
 - o Beginning in October, Roots will move their weekly meetings to Sunday mornings during the Sunday School hour.
- The Preschool/MMO summer program ended August 6 and proved to be successful. The Fall session begins August 24 with 51 students enrolled.
- Agreed to continue a yearly scholarship to Lenoir Rhyne for the 2020-2021 academic year.
- The Family Life Center cannot be used until roof issues are resolved. Repair estimates are still outstanding but early updates are encouraging in that the cost may not be as high as originally anticipated.
- Still waiting for an update on the password protected option of the church yearbook/directory on LCC website.
- The majority of the newly purchased streaming equipment has arrived, the remaining expected in the coming days.
- Expenses exceeded revenues in the month of July however, actual year to date revenues as of July 31, 2020 reflect a positive balance of \$19,255.

The next regular meeting is scheduled for Sunday, September 13.

A special thank you to our loving and generous church family's continued support of Crisis Assistance Ministry. We have delivered 599 bags of food since April to Crisis Assistance Ministry. What a blessing to be able to help feed our neighbors during this terrible pandemic and time of isolation. Social Ministry Committee will continue to check the box and deliver to CAM during this time. If you are able and choose to continue, we will share your blessing with others. CAM does a wonderful job of meeting the needs of our community and are so thankful for our deliveries every week.

Financial results have been quite positive over the last 7 months of FY 2020. Receipts as expected trended slightly downward for month of June and July. Expectations of this trend will possibly continue for the next 2 months. Actual cash increase over expenses for the year of \$19,254.86 should be considered a cushion to cover any shortfalls that may occur during the summer months. It appears at this point August is going to be very good overall.
