





STORY OF SALVATION LESSON

GENESIS 50:15-20

Providence and faithfulness are revealed in the journey of Joseph. By forgiveness, Israel is delivered.

¹⁵Realizing that their father was dead, Joseph's brothers said, "What if Joseph still bears a grudge against us and pays us back in full for all the wrong that we did to him?" ¹⁶So

they approached Joseph, saying, "Your father gave this instruction before he died, ¹⁷'Say to Joseph: I beg you, forgive the crime of your brothers and the wrong they did in harming you.' Now therefore please forgive the crime of the servants of the God of your father." Joseph wept when they spoke to him. ¹⁸Then his brothers also wept, fell down before him, and said, "We are here as your slaves." ¹⁹But Joseph said to them, "Do not be afraid! 

So disappointed that we will not be able to provide our church family with the annual soup luncheon. We always look forward to this meal and the wonderful fellowship with everyone. We have decided that the safest way is to give families a \$25.00 Food Lion gift card to help with their Thanksgiving meal. We normally fill 140-150 meal bags each year.
