

STORY OF SALVATION LESSON

SONG OF SOLOMON 2:1-7, 6:1-3

The gift of husband to wife and wife to husband, the gift of God blessing and seeking His beloved bride the Church, this is the theme of the Song of Solomon. It is a gift for us today and points to the fulfillment to come.

¹I am a rose of Sharon. a lily of the valleys. ²As a lily among brambles, so is my love among maidens. ³As an apple tree among the trees of the wood, so is my beloved among young men. With great delight I sat in his shadow, and his fruit was sweet to my taste. ⁴He brought me to the banqueting house, and his intention toward me was love. ⁵Sustain me with raisins. refresh me with apples; for I am faint with love. ⁶O that his left hand were under my head, and that his right hand embraced me! ⁷I adjure you, O daughters of Jerusalem, by the gazelles or the wild does: do not stir up or awaken love until it is ready! ¹ Where has your beloved gone, O fairest among women? Which way has your beloved turned, that we may seek him with you? ²My beloved has gone down to his garden, to the beds of spices, to pasture his flock in the gardens, and to gather lilies. ³I am my beloved's and my beloved is mine; he pastures his flock among the lilies. ²Ascribe to the Lord the glory due God's name; worship the Lord in the beauty of holiness. ³The voice of the Lord is upon the waters; the God of glory thunders;

⁴The voice of the Lord is a powerful voice; the voice of the Lord is a voice of splendeor. ⁵The voice of the Lord breaks the cedar trees; the Lord breaks the cedars of Lebanon; ⁶The Lord makes Lebanon skip like a calf, and Mount Hermon like a young wild ox.

⁸The voice of the Lord shakes the wild_rness; the Lord shakes the wilderness of Kadesh.

SECOND LESSON

ACTS 19:1-7

In Ephesus, Paul encounters people who had received John's baptism of repentance but had never heard of the Holy Spirit or of baptism in the name of Jesus. After Paul baptizes them, the Holy Spirit comes upon them and empowers them with gifts of the Spirit.


¹While Apollos was in Corinth, Paul passed through the interior regions and came to Ephesus, where he found some disciples. ²He said to them, "Did you receive the Holy Spirit when you became believers?" They replied, "No, we have not even heard that there is a Holy Spirit." ³Then he said, "Into what then were you baptized?" They answered, "Into John's baptism." ⁴Paul said, "John baptized with the baptism of repentance, telling the people to believe in the one who was to come after him, that is, in Jesus." ⁵On hearing this, they were baptized in the name of the Lord Jesus. ⁶When Paul had laid his hands on them, the Holy Spirit came upon them, and they spoke in tongues and prophesied—⁷altogether there were about twelve of them.

Response after the announcement:

C: Glory to You, O Lord.

Mark's gospel reports the story of Jesus' baptism with some irony: the one on whom the Spirit descends is himself the one who will baptize others with the Holy Spirit.

⁴John the baptizer appeared in the wilderness, proclaiming a baptism of repentance for the forgiveness of sins. ⁵And people from the whole Judean countryside and all the people of Jerusalem were going out to him, and were baptized by him in the river Jordan, confessing their sins. ⁶Now John was clothed with camel's hair, with a leather belt around his waist, and he ate locusts and wild honey. ⁷He proclaimed, "The one who is more powerful than I is coming after me; I am not worthy to stoop down and untie the thong of his sandals. ⁸I have baptized you with water; but he will baptize you with the Holy Spirit."

⁹In those days Jesus came from Nazareth of Galilee and was baptized by John in the Jordan. ¹⁰And just as he was coming up out of the water, he saw the heavens torn apart and the Spirit descending like a dove on him. ¹¹And a voice came from heaven, "You are my Son, the Beloved; with you I am well pleased."

P: The Gospel of the Lord.

C: Praise to You, O Christ.


The Law is an aspect in the Word that shows our brokenness, sin and need for Jesus' saving power: Baptism is just a church ritual or sentimental symbol.

The Gospel is an aspect in the Word that gives strength, wisdom and hope in Jesus' *ultimate saving power:* The gift of Holy Baptism means we belong to God and we will be His forever.

So What? The gift of my baptism connects me to the Father, + the Son, and the Holy Spirit and to His people - the dead, the living, and those yet to come. Remember your baptism and that **you belong to Him** always.



THE NICENE CREED

All are invited to confess our faith in God: Father, Son, and Holy Spirit. If you have not received the gift of baptism or would like to affirm your faith in Jesus and join His mission here, please indicate on the attendance registry and talk to an usher or the pastor.

We believe in one God, the Father, the Almighty, maker of heaven and earth, of all that is, seen and unseen. We believe in one Lord, Jesus Christ, the only Son of God, eternally begotten of the Father, God from God, Light from Light, true God from true God, begotten, not made, of one Being with the Father. Through him all things were made. For us and for our salvation he came down from heaven: by the power of the Holy Spirit he became incarnate from the virgin Mary, and was made man. For our sake he was crucified under Pontius Pilate; he suffered death and was buried. On the third day he rose again in accordance with the Scriptures; he ascended into heaven and is seated at the right hand of the Father. He will come again in glory to judge the living and the dead, and his kingdom will have no end.

We believe in the Holy Spirit, the Lord, the giver of life, who proceeds from the Father and the Son. With the Father and the Son he is worshiped and glorified. He has spoken through the prophets. We believe in one holy catholic and apostolic Church. We acknowledge one Baptism for the forgiveness of sins. We look for the resurrection of the dead, and the life of the world to come. Amen
