CHILDREN'S MESSAGE


FIRST LESSON ACTS 10:44-48

While Peter shares the good news of Jesus with a Gentile soldier and his family, the Holy Spirit comes upon them. Recognizing that the Spirit works inclusively in the lives of both Jews and Gentiles, Peter commands that these Gentiles also be baptized in the name of Jesus Christ.

⁴⁴While Peter was still speaking, the Holy Spirit fell upon all who heard the word. ⁴⁵The circumcised believers who had come with Peter were astounded that the gift of the Holy Spirit had been poured out even on the Gentiles, ⁴⁶for they heard them speaking in tongues and extolling God. Then Peter said, ⁴⁷"Can anyone withhold the water for baptizing these people who have received the Holy Spirit just as we have?" ⁴⁸So he ordered them to be baptized in the name of Jesus Christ. Then they invited him to stay for several days.

The Law is an aspect in the Word that shows our brokenness, sin and need for Jesus' saving power: I am not qualified to stand up and speak out. Why do I not trust God in the moment given to stand up and speak out for Him? Why do I fall into the cynicism of the world so easily?

The Gospel is an aspect in the Word that gives strength, wisdom and hope in Jesus' ultimate saving power: In the power of the risen Jesus who loves us always we can stand up and speak out and rejoice now and forever.

So What? Rejoice in the Lord Jesus - that joy is open to each of us anytime and anywhere. He causes us to bear fruit not our own planning and qualifying but He will do what is needful within us and among us and for us to the glory of our Father in Heaven.


