Sunday School: Some Gifts as an Adult Disciple

Bible study and small group fellowship = Sunday School! This has been missing among us during the days of the covid-19 pandemic and the plan is to restart this crucial ministry for all ages. Last month I shared some gifts from my youth and here are some gifts I've gotten from Bible study as an adult disciple of Jesus Christ.

Make me to know Your ways, O LORD; teach me Your paths. Lead me in Your truth and teach me, for You are the God of my salvation; for You I wait all day long. (Psalm 25:4-5)

I studied this and began praying this Psalm regularly as I went through Clinical Pastoral Education at Broad River Correctional Institute. Here I realized I need God to make me and teach me directly. The self-improvement books, my pitifully weak will, my short-sighted resolutions for action just cannot do it. I need God to make me and He has and He has guided me and He continues to do this as I turn to Him over and over again. To this day may God make me follow His way and may I wait for Him!

My God, my God, why have You forsaken me? (Mark 15:33)

During Lent at Christus Victor Lutheran Church in Columbia, my teacher Dr. Sigel taught on the passion story in St. Mark. God made known to us in suffering and death. The words of Psalms on the lips of our Lord Jesus at His death for me, for us. Jesus went through this for me, for us? I have felt forsaken at times. But our Lord knows my heart and my hurt so I learned how to vent, to cry out, and to take my hurt to His Cross confession by confession, Sunday by Sunday. There are many things I can only share fully with Jesus.

There is great gain in godliness combined with contentment; for we brough nothing into the world, so that we can take nothing out of it...For the love of money is a root of all kinds of evil, and in their eagerness to be rich some have wandered away from the faith and pierced themselves with many pains. (1 Timothy 6:6-7, 10)

While preparing to teach on the missionary journeys of Paul at Ebenezer Lutheran Church in China Grove, I ran across the gift and opportunity of contentment. The rich person desires nothing is what St. John Chrysostom counseled on this verse. So, it is in the desire. When content with who we are and what we have there are the true riches for all who abide in Christ.

The borrower is the slave of the lender. (Proverbs 22:7)

This verse came to my attention from the Financial Peace class that has been offered from time to time here at Lutheran Chapel. Essentially this class goes through the book of Proverbs and hits on a number of areas connecting personal finances and biblical counsel. The debt problem is immense and, reflecting on the matter, this is one of the



LUTHERAN CHAPEL COUNCIL MINUTES JULY 11, 2021

The Council made decisions and discussed the following:

- Council approved the purchase of new Sunday School material for the youth, covering the Fall, Winter and Spring quarters (Summer not included).
- Council authorized James Dean to work an additional 5 hours/week, at least through "growing" season in order to maintain the grounds.
- Committee is looking into a possible Chapel renovation. Lighting company is visiting at a date TBD to provide suggestions to meet our needs. Ultimately, the committee will present options to Council for consideration regarding renovation.
- Council approved paying \$7941.00 for a new AC unit in the kitchen via GSM. Purchase includes a 5-year total parts and labor warranty.
- Remaining COVID-19 protocols will go away on Sept. 12, including choir processional/recessional, return of acolytes/crucifers, offering, communion, etc.
- Luther Choir will start rehearsing on Sunday Mornings beginning in September before Sunday School.
- Worship & Music Committee is sponsoring an ice cream social/hymn sing on Saturday, Aug. 21 in the Family Life Center.
- Church Council will sponsor a Wednesday night speaker dinner sometime in October for all church members. Date TBD.

The next Council meeting will be held in Sept. 12.

Actual cash and contributions decreased slightly in the month of June. These decreases are a reflection of the summer months normal financial activity. Due to slightly lower attendance in June, contributions and deficits in excess cash are seen. These trends tend to run through August and sometimes into the beginning of September however, financial activities typically return to their normal levels in September-October time frame. The Finance Committee will continue to observe month to month results.

We have been truly blessed at Lutheran Chapel for the faithfulness of our church family and their gifts to our church.

Crisis Assistance Ministry

Our love offering for **August** will be for Crisis Assistance Ministry. This ministry would not be possible without the financial gifts, food donations, and volunteer hours that 48 congregations in our county provide. The participation of our congregation is essential to ensure that CAM has an adequate food supply and enough money to meet the requests for assistance that they receive. CAM feeds 330 families each month and gives financial assistance to families in need. During the past year of the pandemic, our church family has continued to generously give bags of food to CAM. Last year we delivered 1,051 bags of food and they have been so grateful for our contributions because they have not received as much support during this time. Thank you to all who have placed food in our food collection box outside the office door. Social Ministry Committee will continue to deliver to CAM as donations are given.

It is vital to our community of neighbors that suffer under the burden of poverty and for those in financial crisis that we continue to support this ministry. CAM is continually tweaking their programs to improve the way that the needs of our community are met. The fact that CAM is very successful in meeting the needs of families and individuals is the very reason we need to continue to support them.

Our congregation is always very generous each month to our love offerings and we appreciate the support and love that you give to ministries as they work to stop the suffering of our neighbors.



Charles and Ann Edwards will provide the wine from Baker's for our communion.


