
CHILDREN'S MESSAGE

FIRST LESSON 1 KINGS 19:4-8

First Kings chapter 18 describes the contest between Elijah and the prophets of Baal. The contest proves that the LORD is God, and afterward Elijah orders the killing of the Baal prophets. Angered by the deaths of her prophets, Queen Jezebel threatens to kill Elijah. This reading finds Elijah fleeing, fatigued, and in utter despair.

⁴[Elijah] went a day's journey into the wilderness, and came and sat down under a solitary broom tree. He asked that he might die: "It is enough; now, O LORD, take away my life, for I am no better than my ancestors." Then he lay down under the broom tree and fell asleep. Suddenly an angel touched him and said to him, "Get up and eat." ⁶He looked, and there at his head was a cake baked on hot stones, and a jar of water. He ate and drank, and lay down again. ⁷The angel of the LORD came a second time, touched him, and said, "Get up and eat, otherwise the journey will be too much for you." ⁸He got up, and ate and drank; then he went in the strength of that food forty days and forty nights to Horeb the mount of God.


Food for the Soul

On Table Blessings

Why do followers of Jesus pray at meals? Scripture and the example of Jesus instruct us. You shall eat your fill and bless the LORD your God for the good land that He has given you (Deuteronomy 8:10). Give thanks in all circumstances (1 Thessalonians 5:18). Our Lord Jesus prayed as can be seen at the feeding of the 5,000 (Matthew 14:19) and the Last Supper (Matthew 26:26-69). Let us pray meal by meal, whenever we eat, thanking Almighty God.

From the Small Catechism, Dr. Martin Luther gives a way to pray before and after eating:

The members of the household are to come devoutly to the table, fold their hands, and recite:

The eyes of all wait upon You, O Lord, and You give them their food in due season. You open wide Your hand and satisfy the desire of every living creature (Psalm 145:15-16).

Then they are to recite the Lord's Prayer (re: 4th petition - give us this day our daily bread) and the following prayer:

Lord God, heavenly Father, bless us and these Your gifts, which we receive from Your bountiful goodness, through Jesus Christ our Lord. Amen.

Similarly, after eating they should in the same manner fold their hands and recite devoutly:

Give thanks to the Lord, for the Lord is good, for God's mercy endures forever. God provides food for the cattle and for the young ravens when they cry. God is not impressed by the might of a horse, and has no pleasure in the speed of a runner, but finds pleasure in those who fear the Lord, in those who await God's steadfast love (Psalm 136:1, 25; 147:9-11).

Then they are to recite the Lord's Prayer (re: 4th petition - give us this day our daily bread) and the following prayer:

We give thanks to You, Lord God our Father, through Jesus Christ our Lord for all Your benefits, You who live and reign forever. Amen.
