On Lamentation and Daily Prayer

To lament is to mourn aloud, wail, to regret, to express sorrow or mourning often demonstratively. The Psalms are full of examples of people of faith pouring out lamentations to the LORD (re: 3-7, 10-14, 22, 51-59 and many more). It is a gift to be able to pour out our hearts to God (Psalm 55:1-3, 22).

The daily prayers, also called the daily office or liturgy of the hours, are times for prayer. I will confess that my keeping of daily prayer is not what it should be. I do pray our church prayer list. I do listen or read the Psalms and daily Scripture lessons. But I get busy (my to-do list is so important, right?) I get forgetful and I take God for granted way too often.

When I have done well in daily prayers is when I have been in personal crisis. When I lived alone in Silverstreet, South Carolina is when I definitely prayed morning and evening. When I went through Clinical Pastoral Education as a student chaplain at Broad River Correctional Institute in Columbia, South Carolina I prayed consistently – especially as the doors locked. Before the birth of our children, I prayed especially Psalm 147:13 "He blesses your children within you" and God blessed us with safe births and good growing up years. As a parish pastor I have prayed through many a church fight both in the congregation and in the denomination. At the death of my Dad, as dementia took away shared memories, lament and daily prayer gave me a comfort and a structure to turn to God for help. I have a special hatred for dementia, Alzheimer's disease, and memory diseases – it has hit three family members and dozens of church family over the years. It is like part of your perspective and reality are being taken away bit by bit. Yet who remembers that experience, who recalls that bit of reality except me – my Father in Heaven does! This makes me grow closer and closer to Him. For some such trials have destroyed faith, hope and love. I am thankful for me at least that my faith, hope, and love in Jesus grows. That is enough personal testimony.

If you are still reading, I commend to you the biblical structure of daily prayers on next page. For Lutheran Christians the primary hours are morning and evening (remember Luther's **Small Catechism**) but all seven daily moments will be listed. Many among us wrestle with sleepless nights, with illness, with great loss and the horrific pandemic continues to infect and be a source of division as a community. May turning to Jesus, honest lamentation and the rhythms of daily prayer be a gift to you.

Mid-Morning – Mark 15:25, Acts 2:1, 14-17 -- Jesus condemned and crucified for us; also, time of the coming of the Holy Spirit

LUTHERAN CHAPEL COUNCIL MINUTES SEPTEMBER 2021

The council met virtually on Sept. 1 to discuss COVID-19 protocols:

- o Council voted to strongly recommend masks at all indoor church events due to recent spikes in virus cases.
- o Council also decided to remain in current COVID-19 protocols during worship services until the number of virus cases went down.
- o Council decided to hold off on returning to having coffee set up prior to Sunday School.

The Council made decisions and discussed the following at the Sept. 12 meeting:

- o The Council voted to accept Adam DeLuca into membership at LCC.
- o Ed Robinson reported that August was the second-best month of the year as it related to giving, with \$34,004 total.
- o Council approved adding 5 hours to James Dean's work week. Extra responsibilities will now include push mowing grass when needed and helping Dirty Collar Workers maintain other parts of the LCC campus.
- o Steve Laws reported new lighting was installed in the Memorial Chapel as part of the improvement project there. The committee has future meetings planned to discuss further upgrades.
- o Upcoming events include an outdoor fall festival on Sunday, Oct. 24 following the 10:30am worship service, catered by Grandma Hoyt's. A soup luncheon is tentatively planned for Sunday, Nov. 7 following the 10:30am worship service.

Council further enhanced COVID-19 protocols virtually on Sept. 15. They include:

- o LCC will not knowingly allow COVID-positive attendees to participate in indoor services/activities.
- o We will provide Contact Information sheets at all Services so that notifications can be made in the event that COVID has materialized with anyone attending.
- o We will strongly discourage indoor visitation following Funeral services.

The next Council meeting will be held on Nov. 14.






Dear College Student Parents,

Actual cash and contributions increased for the month of August. This should be an indication of the start of increased contributions that historically runs through the end of the calendar year. The pandemic has made it hard to project giving consistently from month to month.

Spending for the month was up due to a significant line item, one of our semi-annual payments for property and casualty insurance totaling \$7,800.00. Spending for the year is still under budget (\$23,716.00). Funding for expenses are more than adequate.

October's love offering will be sent to Holy Angels. This ministry was founded in 1955 by the Sisters of Mercy and continues today to provide the highest quality programs and services for children and adults with varying degrees of mental retardation; some of whom have physical disabilities, and are medically fragile requiring specialized care. Programs provided to the residents include residential services, special education, medical services, creative arts therapy, social work, habilitation services, nutrition, recreation, vocational training and opportunities for spiritual growth. The support and donations given to this ministry, offers families the peace of heart and mind in knowing that their special child is receiving the highest quality of compassionate care and a loving home.

Holy Angels currently serves 80 children and adults in the residence program. Some of the residents receive vocational training and enjoy employment at Cherubs Café and Cotton Candy Factory – two small businesses established by Holy Angels in Downtown Belmont. Also, Spruced Goose in McAdenville offers employment to Holy Angel residents. Bliss Gallery was established to offer persons who are differently able the opportunity to share creative abilities and showcase their art alongside the works of guest artists.
