From the Pastor...

Where there is no vision, the people perish: but he that keepeth the law (Torah – teaching of the LORD), happy is he (Proverbs 29:18 King James Version). Part of keeping the teaching of God is **the biblical mission** given from the very beginning. These Scriptures should guide the mission at Lutheran Chapel in 2022 that all of us and all our community may trust in our Lord Jesus.

They devoted themselves to **the apostles' teaching** and **fellowship**, to **the breaking of bread** and **the prayers** (Acts 2:42). And whatever you do, in word or deed, **do everything in the name of the Lord Jesus**, giving thanks to God the Father through Him (Colossians 3:17). For the Son of Man came...to **serve** (Mark 10:45). **Go** therefore into the main streets and invite everyone... **Go** into all nations and make disciples of all (Matthew 28:19, 22:1-14). With these teachings in mind consider the following structural changes based on the biblical mission:

- ⇒ **Apostles' teaching**: Let us focus on restoring a weekly Sunday gathering to get most all of us together offering a **9:00 Discipleship & Fellowship and 10:00 Service** in the Sanctuary. Since the pandemic getting all of us together has been a challenge! The hope here is to get as many as possible to study God's Word, to worship, to fellowship and connect together anew. Prayers will always be streamed but getting together is important.
- ⇒ **Fellowship**: Let us focus on fostering small groups for encouragement in Christ and fun together. In addition to the weekly gathering for Discipleship & Fellowship, let our Sprouts (elementary age) and Roots (youth through High School) meet for regular service and fun events. Let us encourage our Women of the Evangelical Lutheran Church (WELCA) Circles, Brotherhood, and OWLS to **resume** meetings and plan outings in 2022.
- ⇒ **Breaking of bread**: Recognizing not everyone will be able to gather Sunday and that a weekly Holy Communion is important, opportunities to offer "little church" in the Memorial Chapel will be explored. For those unable to attend regularly any Service, home Communion will be offered to all by appointment with the Pastor (not just for those of us shut-in) to keep all who want to be connected to the church connected.
- ⇒ **Prayers**: Let us focus on the practice of daily prayer to grow closer to Christ and to intercede for one another. Our Prayer team is a key mission on the way to growing as an **intentionally praying church**.

I may experiment with offering daily prayer offices at **morning**, **noon**, and **evening** sometime during the week when I pray anyway and have it open for whoever may choose to come.

- ⇒ **Do everything in the Name of our Lord Jesus:** Each one of us is called to serve Christ's kingdom. Our care of **family**, our daily **work**, our service at **church** and in the wider **community** is to be done to the glory of God. This holy vocation is one that we share as the priesthood of all believers and can't be emphasized enough.
- ⇒ Serve: Lutheran Chapel excels at service in Christ's Name to help our neighbor. From the Clothes Closet, the weekly backpack food program to help schools, the on-going collection of food for Crisis Assistance Ministry, the monthly love offerings to support local charities, the Dirty Collar Workers/ Property team caring for the church campus, to the auxiliary ministries that meet here such as the Alcoholics Anonymous group, the Lutheran Chapel Preschool and hosting of other community and church groups many are served and many serve to God's glory here. To make these on-going ministries more visible and to intentionally connect more volunteers to these efforts is a worthy goal.
- ⇒ **Go!** *Invite*: The focus on reaching our entire community for Christ requires **constant invitations** to all. Use of the **electronic church sign** to invite all going up and down New Hope Road to events here, **intentional Services designated to invite friends**, relatives, associates, and neighbors, and **designating events to invite the community** will be important.

In our generation, we are called and equipped in Christ to minister, to adapt, to plan, and to seek His will (Matthew 6:10) to the best of our understanding. Let us trust Christ and work together to His glory in 2022.

LUTHERAN CHAPEL COUNCIL MINUTES NOVEMBER 14, 2021

The Council made decisions and discussed the following at the Nov. 14 meeting:

- Council unanimously approved the 2022 budget, which will be presented to the church membership on Dec. 5.
- Council was informed that GSM had installed the new HVAC system for the kitchen.
- Council approved Tammy Royston, Crown Hoffman, Adrian Thornburg and Dan Lineberger as new council members on a three-year term, beginning in 2022. The new members will be up for affirmation before the church on Dec. 5.
- Council discussed and unanimously approved piloting a 10:00am worship service starting on Jan. 2 and running through June 26. At its May meeting, council will decide if the 10:00am service will continue. Meeting at 10:00am means Sunday school will begin at 9:00am going forward, and there will be no 8:30am service during the pilot period.
- Council approved a new time sheet protocol for James Dean and Kim Rundzieher, effective Dec. 1.
- Council approved a request from the Worship & Music Committee to have wind instruments play on Christmas Eve, as well a choir processional that night (masks required for choir members during the processional).
- Council approved returning communion to the front of the church but in an intinction format, effective in January.
- With Amy Carpenter's resignation effective Nov. 30, council decided it best to ask parents with planning youth activities until there is enough participation from youth/parents to warrant paying a part- or fulltime position.

A congregational meeting will be held Dec. 5. Council's next full meeting will be held in January.

Actual cash and contributions were typical; however, expenses did exceed revenues received for the month of October. November and December are typically very good revenue months. Anticipate this trend to continue as in past years. Expenses through year-end should be light and our year-end cash should remain in a positive position.

We do have one major expenditure to be paid in the month of November. We have had to replace an A/C unit in the kitchen. The cost of the unit was \$7,900.00. This will be paid from the Maintenance Fund in November. The new unit has been installed and we are awaiting final invoice.

Our Love Offering for the month of December is Family Promise of Gaston County. The mission of the Family Promise is to provide compassionate, loving support of meals, shelter, and counseling services through a community-based network to the homeless families of Gaston County. The support fosters and promotes growth for a successful transition to independence.

The organization currently works with several churches in our community to provide temporary housing for homeless families. Also, clothing, and personal items are provided to these families.


Volunteers use their skills, knowledge, and compassion to help our homeless neighbors find employment, reconnect with society, and restore their dignity.

The ministry was previously known as the National Interfaith Hospitality Network but changed their name to Family Promise, to reflect their broad range of programs and vision of ending family homelessness. The name refers to the promise, in the sense of commitment, which communities make to families in need. But it also refers to the promise, the potential, inherent in every family.

JANUARY ~ Cancer Services

Our Love Offerings for the month of January will be given to Cancer Services of Gaston County. This agency has an active presence in our community. Cancer Services provides education about cancer prevention and detection, assists cancer patients and funds cancer research. The mission of Cancer Services is to serve the community by actively promoting healthy lifestyles and to provide support and services needed by people living with cancer. They provide cancer patients with limited financial and medication assistance and medical equipment is loaned free of charge. Also, they provide nutritional supplements, wigs, diapers, bed pads, etc. to cancer patients. Educational programs and free cancer screening clinics are provided to promote public awareness of cancer. Contributions are also made to cancer research to find a cure for this disease.

Everyone is personally affected by cancer at some time in their life. By supporting agencies such as Cancer Services, you are helping people who are suffering with this disease. Your donation can help make a difference in their battle against cancer.


