

Introduction/Bidding Prayer/The "Our Father...":

P: We have come together as the family of God, in our Father's presence, to celebrate the great festival of Jesus' coming into our world.

In this service we hear and receive the good news of Jesus' birth and offer our thanksgiving to God.

As we gather together in the name of Christ, we pray for the world He came to save:

For the church,...that it may be enabled in our generation to surrender anew to God's holy Wisdom, and bear the good news of God's love to our sin-sick world;

For the world,...which is already Christ's, that all its peoples may recognize their responsibility for its future, and may be inspired by the message of Christmas to work together for the establishment of justice, freedom and peace everywhere;

For all in special need,...the sick, the anxious, the lonely, the fearful and the bereaved, that the peace and light of the Christ-child may bring hope and healing to all who sit in darkness. *Intercessions here*.

We commend all for whom we pray to the unfailing mercy of our heavenly Father, and say together, as Christ Himself taught us to pray:

Our Father, who art in heaven,
hallowed be Thy name.
Thy kingdom come, Thy will be done,
On earth as it is in heaven.
Give us this day our daily bread;
and forgive us our trespasses,
as we forgive those who trespass against us;
and lead us not into temptation,
but deliver us from evil.
For Thine is the kingdom,
and the power, and the glory,
forever and ever. Amen.
