From the Pastor ...

Lent 2022 is upon us. The call to "return to the LORD your God" (Joel 2:13) is again lifted up. After pandemic, after apathy, after the many other diversions that occupy me, now is the clarion call to come back to Christ (**Christ has never left me**, intellectually I know this, and even a little self-examination shows me how I am the one who seems to drift away) and the opportunities of Ash Wednesday, Lenten Evening Prayer, and Lenten Sunday worship are all happening this March.

Friends in Christ, the good news is ever new. **God loves us** (Isaiah 43:1-4). **God forgives us** (Isaiah 53). **God sacrifices and gives for us** (John 3:16). The Gospel is **not** "you do your best then God does the rest". The Gospel is **not** "God helps those who first help themselves". The Gospel is **not** "humanity coming to God". The Gospel is God has come, is here now, and will come again to humanity. This treasure, grace upon grace all through life leading to eternal life, is worthy of our full focus and attention. May God give the guidance and understanding to explore this treasure all of our days – especially during Lent.

How do you follow God each day? Here are some aspects of the journey that may help as we return to Him. A little Bible study to share with references in both the Old and New Testament to contemplate.

- Love the neighbor God gives you. Yes, even that neighbor. *Leviticus 19:17-18 and Matthew 25:31-46*
- Work and do all you do to God's glory. *Proverbs 16:3 and Colossians 3:17*
- Eat, drink, enjoy the fruit of your toil and think on excellent things. *Ecclesiastes 2:24-25 and Philippians 4:8-9*



• Invite all to God's love, God's gifts for us, and look forward to the mystery of eternal life. *Isaiah 55 and 1 Corinthians 15*

May our Father in Heaven renew our fellowship, strengthen us for our journeys, and guide us back to Him during Lent 2022.

LUTHERAN CHAPEL CHURCH MEN'S GROUP SPRING PINE NEEDLE SALE UPDATE

For over 20 years, in March, the Men of the Church have sponsored an annual pine needle sale. Proceeds from it have gone to support our scout troop, provide financial assistance for youth mission trips, donations toward our picnic shelter as well as the electronic sign. We have also used our proceeds to beautify our church grounds and many other ministries.

We recently conducted a survey through our weekly church bulletins and monthly newsletter to assist us with the project. For those of you who responded, we very much appreciate your desire to help us. A summary of the responses indicated that there wouldn't be enough volunteers to help unload trailers as well as deliver to our customers for the two weekends in March. Another concern is the lingering Covid issues we are facing in our congregation. *Therefore, the Men of the Church have decided not to sell pine needles this year*.

Over the next few months the Men of the Church will discuss other possible fund raisers that we could get involved in. Any suggestions from our membership would be most appreciated. Thanks again for your support over the years in both purchasing and helping with the pine needle sale.

CAM Food Drive

During the month of April, our church family will participate in our major food collection for Crisis Assistance Ministry. Crisis Assistance Ministry would not be possible without the financial gifts, food donations and volunteer hours that our congregation and other churches provide. Our participation helps ensure that CAM has an adequate food supply and enough money to meet the requests for assistance that they receive each month. Crisis Assistance Ministry feeds an average of over 500 people per month. Also, CAM provides utility, rent or mortgage and prescription assistance.

Bags can be returned to church during the month of April or anytime that is convenient for you and can be placed in the blue CAM food box in the hall outside the youth office. The Social Ministry Committee will deliver the food to Crisis Assistance. We are always proud of the generosity of our church family, and we know that we can count on all of you to make our food drive a successful one.

MARCH LOVE OFFERING

The Cathy Mabry Cloninger Center ~ A Domestic Violence Shelter

Our love offering for March will be sent to The Cathy Mabry Cloninger Center/A Domestic Violence Shelter. The Shelter operates under the direction of the Gaston County Department of Health and Human Resources and has been in operation since April 1982. The Home serves as a temporary shelter for clients to work on goals to establish new housing, jobs, daycare, etc. while providing a safe, emergency residence where victims can live in times of crisis. Other services provided include counseling, court advocacy, and support group meetings for women and a children's programs. When the families leave, the staff wants them to be strong, hopeful for the future and know that there is always someone only a phone call away if help is needed.

Domestic violence statistics continue to rise, therefore it is so important for each of us to take a stand against this deadly and violent problem affecting many innocent women and children. In the United States, a woman is assaulted every nine seconds. We can all play a role in stopping violence and creating a safe environment for people to live and work. In 2020, The Shelter served 482 clients and received 873 calls for help and assistance, and served as home for 134 children.

Also, the Shelter is now part of Gaston County's Family Justice Center called Hope United Survivor Network. Hope United serves survivors of domestic violence, sexual assault, elder abuse, child abuse and human trafficking. Survivors can access many different legal services on site such as court orders and counseling. Working together, these ministries can help survivors begin their journey towards safety, healing, and hope.

The Shelter depends on donations from private citizens, public and private organizations, local industries, and religious groups throughout the county. Please praverfully consider giving a donation to this ministry and help to make a difference.
