

#### **REVELATION 7:9-17**



<sup>22</sup>At that time the festival of the Dedication took place in Jerusalem. It was winter, <sup>23</sup>and Jesus was walking in the temple, in the portico of Solomon. <sup>24</sup>So the Jews gathered around him and said to him, "How long will you keep us in suspense? If you are the Messiah, tell us plainly." <sup>25</sup>Jesus answered, "I have told you, and you do not believe. 
*The Law* is an aspect of God's Word that shows sin and brokenness: I want to go my way. I will not follow the Good Shepherd.




