On Face to Face Time

A man who isolates himself seeks his own desire (Proverbs 18:1). How many are surrounded by people but are in relationship with no one? While our culture seeks the freedom to have sex with whomever we want, spend our money however we want, and live and travel whenever and wherever we want, we ultimately experience the results we didn't want - results of constantly seeking our own desires. Results of an unforeseen bondage to self-centeredness that leaves us lonely, unable to produce committed relationships...we live in a culture that has trained people to believe their availability has no impact on the state of their relational health. What a lie...(True biblical community) is where we "bear one another's burdens" (Galatians 6:2) as opposed to our culture's "come this far but no farther" approach to intimacy...(True biblical community) is where we are accountable to one another "confess your trespasses to one another, and pray for one another, that you may be healed" (James 5:16). **Saved from Success**, by Dale Partridge

This quote from Dale Partridge is very powerful. Since the coronavirus pandemic, really before the pandemic, more and more folks get disconnected, discouraged, and border line depressed. Why? The idol of busyness sweeps us away from one another. The fragmentation of families due to divorce, distance, and difficulties hurts our communities and society. The polarization of people, progressive vs. conservative, Republican vs. Democrat, politics on steroids, distorts any attempt to cultivate the common good.

Even how we use time may be a contributor to this estrangement among us. Use of Time – On average 39 minutes a week is utilized for family face to face time. In contrast, average screen time (cell phone, computer, tablet, TV, etc.) is 7.5 hours a day - 52.5 hours a week - 114 days a year in front of a screen (source: Kaiser Family Foundation kff.org; Screen Time vs. Lean Time cdc.gov.). Might be a factor in the disconnect of many, right? Since this is summer, how much time on average do Americans spend outdoors each day (re: Snow Brains 5/28/21 article)? 87% of an average American's day is spent inside buildings, 6% in automobiles, and only 7% outdoors. So only one half of one day per week is actually outdoors. Is this healthy? Examine yourself and your situation.

What might help restore connections? This is why weekly Bible study/Sunday School face to face is important. Maybe you have an insight to give face to face with others. Maybe you have an insight to receive face to face with others. This is why "little church" on Wednesday nights is important. Maybe the gathering for prayer and fellowship face to face will lift you up. Maybe your presence will lift up someone else. Going to Rankin Lake for outdoor worship together, regular weekly worship at "big church" these summer months, sitting outside in the shade, choosing to get fresh air – these are all important. Face to face gatherings, cultivating connections and relationships are a crucial part of being God's

people in this time and place. This is not to say I am a Luddite and want us to throw away screens. Indeed, I am writing this on a screen \square . I am thankful for screens and on-line opportunities. Those are here to stay. Nevertheless, let us not neglect our need for fellowship with one another and commit to gathering face to face Sunday by Sunday, week by week, as often as possible.

LUTHERAN CHAPEL COUNCIL MINUTES May 15, 2022

The council made decisions and discussed the following at the May 15 meeting:

- A financial report was provided and it was noted that our financial standing through the first four months of the year is good.
- A \$500 match for a church member attending Lenoir Rhyne was approved.
- Membership for Alisa Marlowe was approved.
- Lutheran Chapel's Historical Sketch needs to be updated as requested by the NC Synod. A rough draft has been prepared however there are items in question that may need to be included. Having long-time serving church members review the draft would be ideal.
- All is set for Rankin Lake Service on June 12.
- A new phone tree system was researched and proposed. A few more specifics were requested by some members. An electronic vote will be taken once those questions are answered.
- Two new AEDs are being purchased for the church utilizing funds gifted for this specific purpose. The benefactor family would like a team of 10 church members certified to use the AEDs. A rotation scheduled was suggested so that one certified member be present at each worship service.
- Council voted on and approved to seek a church consultant for the growth of our church. The Synod would assist with the cost.
- Attendance has increased during the 10:00 Service trial period. Council agreed to send out a survey to all church members to get their preference on Sunday School and worship times.
- A one-day VBS program led by youth parents is being held on June 18.

The next council meeting is scheduled for July 10, 2022.

ove Offering to

Our love offering for the month of **June** will be for the Lutheran Support Group of Gaston which provides ongoing support for Faith Farm, Bess Town Road and Mountain Ridge Group Homes. A coalition of Lutheran Churches helps with maintenance and upkeep of these homes and works with Lutheran Services Carolinas and other agencies to provide the use of these properties owned by LSGG for needs in our community.

Mountain Ridge Group Home is currently operating in Gastonia. It is operated and owned by Lutheran Services Carolinas. It serves adults with developmental disabilities.

Faith Farm in Dallas had been serving as transitional housing for the rehabilitation of women veterans. However, the Veterans Administration made the decision to stop funding this project. Therefore, the facility was closed due to lack of funding. Currently, Mountain Ridge Group Home is utilizing Faith Farm as an extended facility for daily activities for their male residents.

The Bess Town Road property is still in the process of being renovated as a home for homeless male veterans. The facility will provide the men a home and enable them to eventually move to a home of their own. This property will be known as Camp Centurion – Gaston Barracks. The Lutheran Support group is working with Camp Centurion to use the Bess Town Road property. Camp Centurion is a non-profit agency whose mission is to provide local veterans who are experiencing a difficult transition from military to civilian life, with the essential secure environment, services and support they need to be able to finally "come home", regardless of the length of time since discharge. Supportive housing will be provided in a secure environment that is structured and supervised. Every veteran will have a personalized plan. There is not a definite date for the opening of this facility, however work is continuing at this property.

Your generous donations are greatly needed and appreciated as the ministry of these homes continue to serve the needs of our community.

JULY ~ Backpack Weekend Food Program

Our Love Offering for the month of July will be the Backpack Weekend Food Program, a ministry of our Outreach Committee. The Backpack Weekend Food Program provides food for school children on weekends. These children may not have anything to eat over a weekend or holiday.

We are now partnered with Hawks Nest and Robinson Elementary to provide food for those children who may need food when they leave school. Each month we pick up food at the Backpack Warehouse, we inventory the food, pack, and deliver to the schools. The cost to feed one elementary student is approximately \$295 per school year.

With your generous donations we are able to provide this food to the children. The number of children may vary throughout the year. The support of the congregation is necessary to continue the ministry.
