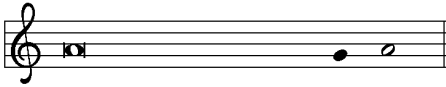

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SECOND LESSON

COLOSSIANS 1:15-28

This letter offers a mystical teaching, that the great mystery of God is “Christ in you.” Because Christ is present in the church, Christians share in his life, suffering, and glory.

¹⁵[Christ Jesus] is the image of the invisible God, the firstborn of all creation;¹⁶for in him all things in heaven and on earth were created, things visible and invisible, whether thrones or dominions or rulers or powers—all things have been created through him and for him. ¹⁷He himself is before all things, and in him all things hold together. ¹⁸He is the head of the body, the church; he is the beginning, the firstborn from the dead, so that he might come to have first place in everything. ¹⁹For in him all the fullness of God was pleased to dwell, ²⁰and through him God was pleased to reconcile to himself all things, whether on earth or in heaven, by making peace through the blood of his cross.

²¹And you who were once estranged and hostile in mind, doing evil deeds, ²²he has now reconciled in his fleshly body through death, so as to present you holy and blameless and irreproachable before him—²³provided that you continue securely established and steadfast in the faith, without shifting from the hope promised by the gospel that you heard, which has been proclaimed to every creature under heaven. I, Paul, became a servant of this gospel.

²⁴I am now rejoicing in my sufferings for your sake, and in my flesh I am completing what is lacking in Christ’s afflictions for the sake of his body, that is, the church. ²⁵I became its servant according to God’s commission that was given to me for you, to make the word of God fully known, ²⁶the mystery that has been hidden throughout the ages and generations but has now been revealed to his saints. ²⁷To them God chose to make known how great among the Gentiles are the riches of the glory of this mystery, which is Christ in you, the hope of glory. ²⁸It is he whom we proclaim, warning everyone and teaching everyone in all wisdom, so that we may present everyone mature in Christ.

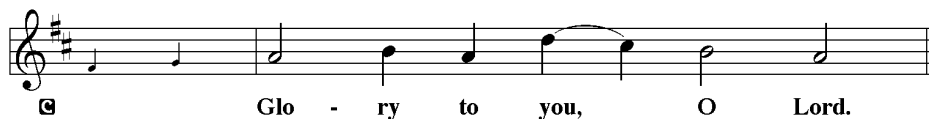

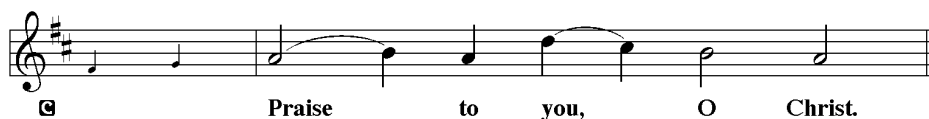
Response after the announcement:

Where is Your Focus?

The Law is an aspect of God's Word that shows sin and brokenness: I do not have time for this. I am too busy to listen to Jesus.

The Gospel is an aspect of God's Word that comforts and saves in Christ: Jesus gives us the opportunity to receive His Word and Spirit each day. Receive Christ now, the better portion is for all who trust in Him.

SCHOOL SUPPLIES: The Social Ministry Committee will be collecting donations for school supplies **today and again next Sunday, July 24th**. Every year we are able to purchase supplies for children that will help begin their school year with the basic needs. Please come prepared with your cash donations as *children will be collecting in school boxes at the end of our worship service*. BACKPACK MINISTRY: The Love Offering for July is The Weekend Backpack Program. This program sends food home with students who may have no food at home over the weekend. They pick up their food at school on Friday afternoon and have things such as fruit cups, crackers, cereal, spaghetti, and a variety of other foods to eat for the weekend. The Outreach Committee manages this program for our church by picking up the food from the warehouse, preparing each student's bag of food, then delivering it to the school. Our committee is running low on funds and needs your help. It costs about \$323 to feed one elementary student and \$385 for one middle school/high school student per school year. Please help us to be able to continue this important food program for the children of Gaston County for the coming school year.
