Reformation 2022

A little over five hundred years ago, Martin Luther posted the 95 Theses on the door of Wittenberg Chapel to debate, to protest abuses and false teaching in the Christian Church of his day. Luther did not get a debate or a parade or a celebration for his posting these 95 Theses. Instead, he was condemned. He was excommunicated from what we now call the Roman Catholic Church. Then the Pope and Holy Roman Emperor tried their best to have Luther murdered. If they were successful, we wouldn't be here this morning. The LORD God preserved Martin Luther and the Protestant movement survived and even thrived and continues to this day.

How dare you read the Bible for yourself? How dare you trust in Christ alone, by faith alone, by grace alone and not Pope or empire or powers of this broken world?

The truth will set us free ultimately (John 8:32)! The reformation of the Christian Church is still very much needed. Reformation is needed in the Roman Catholic Church, the Baptist churches, the Pentecostal churches, and, yes, most resoundingly in the Lutheran churches. True reformation is about turning again to Jesus Christ together. This is not just once but it is **the** right way day by day. Let us turn to Jesus Christ again and again and

trust in Him alone and not in the ways of this world which do not last (Psalm 118:8). Our hope is not in ourselves, our hope is in Jesus Christ and His Word to guide us, comfort us, challenge us and ultimately to save us now and forever.

By grace alone! By faith alone! By Jesus Christ alone! This is what we believe, teach and confess (Formula of Concord) or as Luther put it in the Small Catechism – this is most certainly true. Let us celebrate this on *Reformation Sunday, October 30*. Let us live this always.

LUTHERAN CHAPEL COUNCIL MINUTES SEPTEMBER 18, 2022

The council made decisions and discussed the following:

- The first Church Café meeting will be held January 8, 2023.
- HVAC unit was installed in Youth Hut.
- A work day to clean up the Hut is planned for a day in October.
- AED/First Aid/CPR training is complete and a schedule has been created for Sunday assignments.
- Council voted on and approved the negotiated agreement to hire Kathie Riebe for the Music Director position.
- The previous recommendation to reupholster the furniture in the Pastor's office and sitting area outside the Chapel has moved forward. The cost of this project has been donated.
- Council unanimously approved the purchase of a new desk and credenza for the church office.
- Bids are being sought for a new ice machine.
- Work is still needed on leveling the cement at the entrance of the Education Building.
- Beth Swindler has volunteered to be the Worship & Music Committee Chair.
- Volunteers are needed for streaming Sunday worship services.
- Outreach Committee is hosting a giveaway on October 1.
- Through 8 months, we are fiscally sound and operating with revenues slightly exceeding expenses.

The next scheduled Council meeting is October 16.

Great News! The Soup Luncheon Is Back!



The Social Ministry Committee is excited to invite you to our annual **Soup Luncheon on November 6**th **following our worship service**. We will serve a variety of wonderful soups, sandwiches and of course, delicious desserts. This will also be your opportunity to give thanks for our many blessings. We want to remember those in our community that are less fortunate, by providing them help with their Thanksgiving meal. We are providing families with a \$25.00 Food Lion gift card again this year. We are serving

around 140 families, and it has become very difficult to provide the bags that we have been doing the previous years. With your generous donations, we have been ordering supplies from Aldi Supermarket to fill approximately 70 extra bags. We picked the supplies up with a trailer and brought them to the church to sort into Thanksgiving meal bags. It was a very strenuous labor of love for us (the Social Ministry committee is not as young as we used to be – haha), and the social workers found the cards much easier for them to deliver. There was also the problem with storing the food bags during the times of collection and putting the bags together. We began the gift cards during Covid to eliminate contact and found this was a great way to continue to help families in need.

This ministry was founded in 1955 by the Sisters of Mercy and continues today to provide the highest quality programs and services for children and adults with varying degrees of mental retardation; some of whom have physical disabilities, and are medically fragile requiring specialized care. Programs provided to the residents include residential services, special education, medical services, creative arts therapy, social work, habilitation services, nutrition, recreation, vocational training and opportunities for spiritual growth. Holy Angels currently serves 80 children and adults in the residence program.
