Give Thanks in All Circumstances

Give thanks in all circumstances (1 Thessalonians 5:18). Really? Maybe when things are going well and the sun is shining this makes sense. However, when the dark clouds come in this broken world with so much sorrow, hurt, evil, and loss – how can we give thanks? Isn't that impossible?

Consider the sacred song *Now Thanks We All Our God* by Martin Rinkhart (**Evangelical Lutheran Worship**, #840). Pastor Rinkhart was the only pastor in the town of Eilenburg during the Thirty Years War. Famine and plague broke out in the city in 1637. He was called upon to bury up to forty to fifty people some days. The eight thousand men, women, and children who died during this one year included the death of his own wife. Yet in the midst of loss beyond comprehension, Pastor Rinkhart bore the cross and followed in the way of Jesus through it all. During these days of sorrow, he wrote the great hymn giving thanks:

"Now thank we all our God with hearts and hands and voices, who wondrous things has done, in whom this world rejoices: who, from our mother's arms, has blest us on our way with countless gifts of love, and still is ours today."

The beauty of life shared, the precious gift of mother, father, wife, friend, neighbor, and community, the hope of resurrection life in Jesus Christ – Pr. Rinkhart still gave thanks probably in the midst of tears.

Consider the Pilgrims from that first Thanksgiving. The Pilgrims came to America to worship God and start afresh in the New World after persecutions in England. Yet the harsh environment and cold proved catastrophic to them. Of the original one hundred and two passengers on the Mayflower, nearly half of their number died due to the harsh winter and sickness. Yet those who survived, those who shared in the harvests that fall and benefited from the counsel and help of the Wampanoag Indians, they gave thanks to God for daily bread, for loved ones and their dead in Christ. This first Thanksgiving was celebrated in 1621.

Give thanks in all circumstances teaches the Apostle Paul in his own days of trial as he shared the Gospel to the small church in Thessalonika. This transcendent hope in Christ, this awareness of love shared on Earth and looking to the Love that promises all who believe Heaven above, this faith in Christ may make it possible for us to still give thanks like the saints of old. These two events both in the 1600's are part of our Church

and our National story testifying to our generations about a hope that may sustain us today. Even in tears, let us sing, let us pray, let us love and let us give thanks in the Name of Jesus Christ. Happy Thanksgiving 2022!

LUTHERAN CHAPEL COUNCIL MINUTES OCTOBER 16, 2022

The Council made decisions and discussed the following:

- o Council voted on and approved Ken Obenauf to serve as Treasurer.
- o Bettina Royston has agreed to fill Ed Robinson's position on church council and will be the representative for the Endowment and Memorial Committees.
- o Commitment Sunday is scheduled for November 20, 2022.
- o The Annual Congregational Meeting will be December 4, 2022 to approve the 2023 budget and new council members.
- o Council voted on and approved to have a guardian angel statue in memory of Ed Robinson placed in the Clothes Closet azalea garden.
- The Youth Hut workday was a great success. Plumbing issues are being looked into. Internet connection will be needed. Ready to move forward and purchase furniture, etc.
- o Internet and phone connections are needed in the music director's office located in basement of the church. Kathie will be working in the office several days of the week.
- A refund is being asked for the cement work done at the entrance of the Education Building and other avenues of repair are being researched.
- o The ice machine is being repaired and paid for by an anonymous donor.
- o The church bus had to be repaired again due to the lines being chewed by rodents.
- o Revenues as compared to expenses through September 30, 2022 reflect a positive balance of \$29,675.40.


The next scheduled Council meeting is November 20, 2022.

Great News! The Soup Luncheon Is Back!



The Social Ministry Committee is excited to invite you to our annual **Soup Luncheon on November 6th following our worship service**. We will serve a variety of wonderful soups, sandwiches and of course, delicious desserts. This will also be your opportunity to give thanks for our many blessings. We want to remember those in our community that are less fortunate, by providing them help with their Thanksgiving meal. We are providing families with a \$25.00 Food Lion gift card again this year. We are serving

around 140 families, and it has become very difficult to provide the bags that we have been doing the previous years. With your generous donations, we have been ordering supplies from Aldi Supermarket to fill approximately 70 extra bags. We picked the supplies up with a trailer and brought them to the church to sort into Thanksgiving meal bags. It was a very strenuous labor of love for us (the Social Ministry committee is not as young as we used to be – haha), and the social workers found the cards much easier for them to deliver. There was also the problem with storing the food bags during the times of collection and putting the bags together. We began the gift cards during Covid to eliminate contact and found this was a great way to continue to help families in need.

If you would like to contribute to this ministry, please bring your monetary donations with you to the Soup Luncheon. You may make a cash donation or write a check to Lutheran Chapel – be sure to mark Thanksgiving meals in the memo section of our check. Our committee will purchase the gift cards – we like to purchase the cards that do not allow alcohol or tobacco products to be purchased with the card.

We place each card in an envelope with a Thanksgiving blessing from our church. Last year, we were able to help families at 14 Gaston County schools have a great Thanksgiving. We look forward to seeing everyone at our Soup Luncheon for fellowship and a great meal! We have missed this delicious and fun fellowship with our congregation!

Samaritans Purse Christmas Shoeboxes

Just an early reminder that collection week for Christmas shoeboxes will be November 14th – 20th. We will have boxes available on October 23rd and 30th so that you can fill your we boxes early and get ahead of the Christmas rush.



Boxes must be returned to the church by Sunday November 20th so that we can deliver them to the dropoff location for Gaston County.

Gift suggestions are:

- School Supplies: pens, pencils, crayons, markers, writing pads, coloring and picture books
- Toys: small cars, balls, dolls stuffed animals, kazoos, harmonicas, yo-yos, jump ropes
- Hygiene Items: toothbrush, mild bar soap (in plastic bag), comb, brush, washcloth
- Other: t-shirt, socks, ball caps, sunglasses, hairclips, toy jewelry, flashlights (with extra batteries), plastic cups or storage containers

Do not include: Candy; toothpaste; gum; used or damaged items; scary or war-related items such as toy

guns, knives, or military figures; chocolate or food; seeds; fruit rolls or other fruit snacks; drink mixes (powdered or liquid); liquids or lotions; medications or vitamins; breakable items such as snow globes or glass containers; aerosol cans.

We realize that the Christmas season is a busy time and our church family has many commitments during this time. Please know that we are only offering this opportunity because there are families that want to continue this ministry. NOVMEBER LOVE OFFERING ~ Crisis Pregnancy Center

Our love offering for November is the Crisis Pregnancy Center. CPC has been in Gaston County since 1986 and has served over 65,000 women, men, and their families. During the 35 years of service, as a result of their ministry, they have seen more than 8,700 babies saved. Their mission is to affirm the value of life by compassionately sharing the gospel of Jesus Christ and providing the following services: pregnancy counseling, abstinence education, limited ultrasounds and various other medical services, adolescent parenting programs, abortion education - procedures, risks and alternatives, post abortion counseling to women, men, and families affected by crisis pregnancy situations, with the hope of changing lives. Each year, more than 300 clients accept Jesus Christ as Lord and Savior of their lives – praise be to God!

In addition, the center provides things such as material assistance for babies (diapers, clothing, blankets), material assistance for moms, (pregnancy tests, maternity clothes, necessities for nursing), car seats for infants provided by Speedway Charities and local fire departments, referrals for adoption to Lifeline and other Christian agencies.

We hope you will prayerfully consider supporting this ministry.
