Music Notes



Last month, we sang "Hymn of Promise". I understand it is a new hymn to many of you. And since a hymn means so much more to us if we know a little about it, I offer you this information.

Hymn of Promise was written by Natalie Sleeth who wrote over 180 highly successful anthems for church and school choirs. She wrote the following text in *Adventures for the Soul*, 1987:

This was created when I seem to have been much involved in pondering the ideas of life, and death, spring and winter (which Denver weather was exhibiting about then on alternating days!), Good Friday and Easter, and the whole reawakening of the world that happens every spring. . . . One evening, we entertained a friend for supper, and he, too, had been pondering such themes, and, even shared a work by T.S. Eliot in which there was a phrase something like "In our end is our beginning." That was virtually the catalyst for the form of the text of "Hymn of Promise" which I wrote the next day or two.

I worked on the words very carefully, choosing just the right "pairings," attempting to get across the idea of something inherent in something else even though unseen, and I even bought a tulip plant (though it was in bloom and bright yellow) to contemplate the idea of the "bulb" leading to the flower even though the bulb itself seems "dead." (Sleeth 1987, 113-15)

"Hymn of promise" was first performed in anthem form at the Pasadena Community Church, St. Petersburg, Florida, March 1985, during a festival weekend and concert of the author's music. Since the word "hymn" is in the title, this "suggests that perhaps a congregation could sing it, and since it is basically a unison number (with Alleluia descant on the last verse) that is possible." (Sleeth 1987, 115)

The author included this epilogue:

Soon after writing "Hymn of Promise," my husband [Ronald] became ill with what turned out to be a terminal malignance. As the end neared he asked me to use "Hymn of Promise" as one of the anthems at his funeral service – which was done – and I subsequently (at publication) dedicated the piece to him. Again, a "mysterious" set of circumstances, but – perhaps again – a sort of "preparation." (Sleeth 1987, 115)

JUNE LOVE OFFERING Lutheran Support Group of Gaston County

Our love offering for the month of June will be for the Lutheran Support Group of Gaston which provides ongoing support for Faith Farm, Bess Town Road and Mountain Ridge Group Homes. A coalition of Lutheran Churches helps with maintenance and upkeep of these homes and works with Lutheran Services Carolinas and other agencies to provide the use of these properties owned by LSGG for needs in our community.

Mountain Ridge Group Home is currently operating in Gastonia. It is operated and owned by Lutheran Services Carolinas. It serves adults with developmental disabilities.

Faith Farm in Dallas had been serving as transitional housing for the rehabilitation of women veterans. However, the Veterans Administration made the decision to stop funding this project. Therefore, the facility was closed due to lack of funding. Currently, Mountain Ridge Group Home is utilizing Faith Farm as an extended facility for daily activities for their male residents.

The Bess Town Road property is still in the process of being renovated as a home for homeless male veterans. The facility will provide the men a home and enable them to eventually move to a home of their own. This property will be known as Camp Centurion – Gaston Barracks. The Lutheran Support group is working with Camp Centurion to use the Bess Town Road property. Camp Centurion is a non-profit agency whose mission is to provide local veterans who are experiencing a difficult transition from military to civilian life, with the essential secure environment, services and support they need to be able to finally "come home", regardless of the length of time since discharge. Supportive housing will be provided in a secure environment that is structured and supervised. Every veteran will have a personalized plan. There is not a definite date for the opening of this facility, however work is continuing at this property.

Your generous donations are greatly needed and appreciated as the ministry of these homes continue to serve the needs of our community.


