LUTHERAN CHAPEL COUNCIL MINUTES — MAY 22, 2023

Council made decisions and discussed the following:

- A financial report was provided and it was noted that our financial standing is good.
- An Education Fund was created using \$5,000 of earned interest from the Robinson Fund.
- Request to receive John and Pam Livingston as members of Lutheran Chapel was unanimously approved. Will Clark and Lillian Robinson to be confirmed on Pentecost Sunday.
- Funds to repair roof will come from the Endowment Fund. Ladies choir area and hall are still flooding with heavy rains.
- Hoping to schedule some youth events to be held in the Youth Hut during the summer months.
- The search for a new organist is underway.
- Dr. Copeland was present for a portion of the meeting to discuss the outcome of the two Cafés and to assist in defining how to move toward the mission of sharing God's Love. Council completed exercises to determine actions and developed the following mission statement: *The mission of LCC is to share God's love by nurturing, connecting, and serving.*

The next full council meeting is scheduled for July 23.



July's love offering will be sent to Holy Angels. This ministry was founded in 1955 by the Sisters of Mercy and continues today to provide the highest quality programs and services for children and adults with varying degrees of mental retardation; some of whom have physical disabilities, and are medically fragile requiring specialized care. Programs provided to the residents include residential services, special education, medical services, creative arts therapy, social work, habilitation services, nutrition, recreation, vocational training and opportunities for spiritual growth. The support and donations given to this ministry, offers families the peace of heart and mind in knowing that their special child is receiving the highest quality of compassionate care and a loving home.

Holy Angels currently serves 80 children and adults in the residence program. Some of the residents receive vocational training and enjoy employment at Cherubs Café and Cotton Candy Factory – two small businesses established by Holy Angels in downtown Belmont. Also, Spruced Goose in McAdenville offers employment to Holy Angel residents. Bliss Gallery was established to offer persons who are differently able the opportunity to share creative abilities and showcase their art alongside the works of guest artists.

Like the individuals that depend on their care, Holy Angels, depends on the support of others to provide the highest quality of care. All contributions are welcomed from each individual and from corporate donations. Holy Angels continues to strive to provide loving care and is committed to helping and challenging residents to reach their highest potential. At Holy Angels, it is about little miracles.
