Reformation 2023

A little over five hundred years ago, Martin Luther posted the **95 Theses** on the door of Wittenberg Chapel to debate, to protest abuses and false teaching in the Christian Church of his day. Luther did not get a debate or a parade or a celebration for his posting these **95 Theses**. Instead, he was condemned. He was excommunicated from what we now call the Roman Catholic Church. Then the Pope and Holy Roman Emperor tried their best to have Luther murdered. If they were successful, there probably would not be any Protestant churches and especially any Lutheran churches such as Lutheran Chapel. However, according to God's Providence, Martin Luther lived and the Protestant movement continues to this very day.

How dare you read the Bible for yourself! How dare you trust in Christ alone, by faith alone, by grace alone and not Pope or empire or powers of this broken world!

The truth will set us free ultimately (John 8:32)! The reformation of the Christian Church is still very much needed. Reformation is needed in the Roman Catholic Church, the Baptist churches, the Pentecostal churches, and, yes, most resoundingly in the Lutheran churches. True reformation is about turning again to Jesus Christ together. This is not just once but it is **the** right way to turn to Christ day by day. Let us turn to Jesus Christ anew and trust in Him alone and not in the ways of this world which will not last (Psalm 118:8).

Our hope is not in ourselves, our hope is in Jesus Christ and His Word to guide us, comfort us, challenge us and ultimately to save us now and forever.

By grace alone! By faith alone! By Jesus Christ alone! This is what "we believe, teach and confess" (Formula of Concord) or as Luther put it in the Small Catechism – this is most certainly true. Let us celebrate this on Reformation Sunday, October 29, 2023. Wear red. Let us celebrate our heritage.

Ein' feste Burg ist unser Gott

Here is some information about a hymn that we will be singing this month, "A Mighty Fortress is Our God", written by Martin Luther and based on Psalm 46.

We think of Martin Luther as a great reformer, bible translator, political leader, fiery preacher, and theologian. But he was also a musician, having been born in an area of Germany known for its music. There in his little Thuringian village, young Martin grew up listening to his mother sing. He joined a boys' choir that sang at weddings and funerals. He became proficient with eh flute (recorder), and his volcanic emotions often erupted in song.

When the Protestant Reformation began, Luther determined to restore worship to the German church. He worked with skilled musicians to create new music for Christians, to be sung in the vernacular. He helped revive congregational singing and wrote a number of hymns.

Often he "borrowed" popular secular melodies for his hymns, though occasionally a tune brought criticism and he was "compelled to let the devil have it back again" because it was too closely associated with bars and taverns.

In the forward of a book, Luther once wrote: "Next to the Word of God, the noble art of music is the greatest treasure in the world. It controls our thoughts, minds, hearts, and spirits."

LUTHERAN CHAPEL CONGREGATIONAL COUNCIL MINUTES SEPTEMBER 17, 2023

Council made decisions and discussed the following:

- A financial report was provided and it was noted that although expenses for the month of August exceeded receipts, Lutheran Chapel is still under budget overall for the year.
- Discussion was held regarding Dr. Copeland's consultation process and the next steps. Additional gatherings and discussion are needed to provide more definition and guidance to create a longer-term plan. Groups need to reconnect in order to develop SMART goals. Council members to reach out to group members to remind them of ideas discussed.
- Additional candidates have submitted their resumés for consideration of the organist position. Review of the candidates and possible interviews will be forthcoming.
- Roof repairs are almost complete.

The next full council meeting is scheduled for November 19, 2023.
