Council made decisions and discussed the following:

- A financial report was provided and it was noted that our financial standing is good.
- Chimes are in need of repair.
- An update on the organist was provided (see below).
- The first youth event was held on June 23. Four youth attended and had a great time. More such events to be planned in the coming months.
- Roof is in need of repair.
- Skip Bradley will serve as Trustee on Cemetery Endowment.
- A suggestion was put forth to use memorial funds to hire someone to get the grounds cleaned up and back in shape.

The next full council meeting is scheduled for September 17, 2023.

An Update from the Organist Search Committee...

As you know, I am the chair of the search committee for an organist for Lutheran Chapel; the other members of the search committee include Katherine Sanders, Mark Thornburg, andgive you Kathie Riebe. Crown Hoffman, as President of Council, is involved as well. I would like to keep you updated as to the search for a qualified organist.

The committee and I have posted our organist job description to the following websites and organizations:

- ⇒ The national chapter of the American Guild of Organists (AGO)
- ⇒ The Charlotte chapter of the AGO
- ⇒ dozens of colleges and universities in North Carolina
- ⇒ Lutheran Chapel's Facebook page and website

As a result of these postings, we received interest from a recent college graduate whose primary instrument is the saxophone and who also has some experience playing the organ. He was interviewed, including playing the organ for us, but his organ skills were not at the level needed.

We later received notice from a professional piano player with a doctorate in music. She and I spoke by phone. By the end of the conversation, she was not willing to set up an interview date. She has not been in communication with me since that time.

During this job search process, I have been told by many professors at various music departments in North Carolina, that the number of students who are showing an interest in the organ has plummeted over the last 15 years or so. I have also spoken with retired organists, and they are not interested in returning to work.

There appears to be a very small pool of qualified candidates. However, rest assured that I will continue to persevere in this search. Your prayers in this search process are much appreciated!

The Social Ministry Committee would like to sincerely thank our congregational family for your generous donations to help supply children in our area with school supplies. The final total given was \$2,628.00. We were able to purchase 200 (3-ring) notebooks, 4,032 pencils, 80 pencil boxes, 310 bound composition notebooks, 681 spiral composition notebooks, 100 packages of notebook paper, 3,220 pencil cap erasers, 200

large erasers, 300 boxes of crayons, 20 boxes of colored pencils, 180 pairs of scissors, 1,200 glue sticks, 453 prong folders, 228 highlighters, 64 boxes of Kleenex, and 64 packages of disinfecting wipes. Also, a member of our church family worked with their employer to partner with us and they donated 60 sets of headphones for students to use with their Chromebooks. The supplies were given to Bessemer City Primary and Bessemer City Central and with the help of teachers, school counselors, and social workers, children will receive needed supplies.





The staff at Bessemer City schools were so very grateful for our donations to their students. We pray that this gives each child the same opportunity as other children to begin the school year prepared and proud of their new supplies. This could be the encouragement they need to jumpstart a successful and fun school year. We know this will make a difference in the lives of these children and we are so grateful for your love and support.
