



STORY OF SALVATION LESSON

GENESIS 50:15-20

Providence and faithfulness are revealed in the journey of Joseph. By forgiveness, Israel is delivered.

¹⁵Realizing that their father was dead, Joseph's brothers said, "What if Joseph still bears a grudge against us and pays us back in full for all the wrong that we did to him?" ¹⁶So they approached Joseph, saying, "Your father gave this instruction before he died, ¹⁷Say to Joseph: I beg you, forgive the crime of your brothers and the wrong they did in harming you.' Now therefore please forgive the crime of the servants of the God of your father." Joseph wept when they spoke to him. ¹⁸Then his brothers also wept, fell down before him, and said, "We are here as your slaves." ¹⁹But Joseph said to them, "Do not be afraid! Am I in the place of God? ²⁰Even though you intended to do harm to me, God intended it for good, in order to preserve a numerous people, as he is doing today.

SECOND LESSON 1 PETER 3:18-22

As God acted through Christ's suffering and death to bring us to God, so God acts through baptism to save us from a sinful existence. This spiritual cleansing marks our new life in Christ.

¹⁸Christ also suffered for sins once for all, the righteous for the unrighteous, in order to bring you to God. He was put to death in the flesh, but made alive in the spirit, ¹⁹in which also he went and made a proclamation to the spirits in prison, ²⁰who in former times did not obey, when God waited patiently in the days of Noah, during the building of the ark, in which a few, that is, eight persons, were saved through water. ²¹And baptism, which this prefigured, now saves you—not as a removal of dirt from the body, but as an appeal to God for a good conscience, through the resurrection of Jesus Christ, ²²who has gone into heaven and is at the right hand of God, with angels, authorities, and powers made subject to him.

The Story of the Patriarch Joseph


Temptations - Why?

The Law is an aspect in the Word that shows our brokenness, sin and need for Jesus' saving power: Why does the Holy Spirit lead Jesus, Son of God and Son of Man, to be tempted by Satan for 40 days and nights? Why does God permit temptations and trials anyway?

The Gospel is an aspect in the Word that gives strength, wisdom and hope in Jesus' ultimate saving power: Jesus is true to do the will of our Father in Heaven and does not fall to the temptations of the evil one. May His strength and holy Name be our refuge when we face trials in this sin-sick world.

So What? Forgive those who hurt you even family like Joseph did of old. If you can't forgive, ask God to grow you to both forgive wrong and to keep healthy boundaries. Remember vengeance belongs to God and not us. Call upon our Lord Jesus in the hours of trial that (sadly) come to us in our broken human condition.







Please take your communion cup as you leave and discard in trashcan.






