On Contemplating the Passion of our Lord - Lent 2024

Betrayal. Lies. Injustice. Cruelty. Suffering. Death. These are all constituent parts of contemplating the Passion of our Lord Jesus. They were part of the human condition then. They are part of our human condition now.

How many evils do human beings made in God's own image do to other human beings made in God's own image? It is justified, right? How often do we self-justify and self-rationalize why evils are to be done? "And this is the judgement: the Light has come into the world, and people loved the darkness" (John 3:19). God help us.

Seder Meal

Maundy Thursday, March 28 ~ 6:00pm

Family Life Center



Moses said, "Thus says the Lord: About midnight I will go out through Egypt. Every firstborn in the land of Egypt shall die, from the firstborn of Pharaoh who sits on his throne to the firstborn of the female slave who is behind the hand mill, and the firstborn of the livestock. Then there will be a loud cry throughout the whole land of Egypt, such as has never been or will ever be again. But not a dog shall growl at any of the Israelites—not at the people, not at animals—so that you may know that the Lord makes a distinction between Egypt and Israel.

The Lord said to Moses and Aaron in the land of Egypt:Tell the whole congregation of Israelthey are to take a lamb for each family... without blemish....they shall eat it roasted over the fire....This is how you shall eat it: your loins girded, your sandals on your feet, your staff in your hand; and you shall eat it hurriedly. It is the Passover of the Lord.

These lines from Exodus briefly describe the Passover of God from the last plague issued to Egypt. Passover is the most holy of Jewish holidays and commemorations, and is exactly what Jesus and the disciples were doing in that upper room the night before the crucifixion.

Passover is more than a festival. It is an elaborate teaching experience intended to call people to their identity as the People of God. It is a way to confess faith in God who has acted in history for our benefit out of his boundless love.

Since the temple in Jerusalem was destroyed in 70 AD Jews celebrate the Passover in their homes with a Passover Seder. Seder is the Hebrew word for "order" or "procedure" because of the fixed order of the service.

On Thursday, April 14, also known as Maundy Thursday, from the Latin word "mandatum" meaning mandate or commandment, our Lutheran Chapel family will have a Christian Seder Meal at 6:00 in the Family Life Center We offer this service every other year on Maundy Thursday. The meal should not be considered a full evening meal as such but there will be plenty of food to eat. It is a meal which involves all 5 senses. The Seder is one of the most beautiful and meaningful services that we offer. It joins our Lutheran Chapel family with a 3000 year old community of faith, and is a very good way to prepare for the observance of Good Friday and the celebration of Easter.

One of Jesus' last earthy acts was the celebration of the Passover. Gathering His disciplesin a small room in Jerusalem, He led them in a Passover Seder, "I have eagerly desired to eat this Passover with you before I suffer." (Luke 22:15)

The Worship and Music Committee is putting together plans for our Seder Meal on Thursday, March 28, 2024 at 6:00PM in the Family Life Center. We need to get an approximate number to plan accordingly. CONGREGATIONAL COUNCIL MINUTES

January 21, 2024

Council made decisions and discussed the following:

- The new council took vows.
- A financial report was presented and overall Lutheran Chapel is in excellent financial shape. As of December 31, 2023, revenue as compared to expenses reflect a positive balance of over \$37,000. A portion of this revenue is earmarked for the Courtyard Beautification project. Memorial Fund money that has been untouched for years will be used towards the courtyard project.
- Jenny Williamson volunteered to be 2024 Vice President and was unanimously approved by council.
- Council representatives were assigned/renewed for church committees.
- Kim Rundzieher submitted a letter of intent to retire as of March 28. The search for a replacement is underway.
- Discussion was held regarding security. Do we need more security for events outside of Sunday
 morning services or do we utilize our own security team given the training is sufficient. A reactionary
 class can be provided for further training.
- Parsonage heat system needs a new motherboard or may need to be replaced. The Property Committee is watching it for now while obtaining bids for repair/replacement.

The next full council meeting, including new council members, is scheduled for March 17, 2024.

I Bind Unto Myself Today (Saint Patrick's Breastplate)

This hymn or poem is adapted from a work attributed to Saint Patrick who was a missionary to Ireland in the fifth century. He is known as the Apostle of Ireland.

The lyrics below were adapted by Cecil Francis Alexander (1818-1895). She was born in Ireland. Not only was she a poet and hymnwriter, she also cared for the poor and opened a school for the deaf.

As with many hymns, there are different versions with different verses. It can be found in the ELW on page 450 and only includes 4 verses as well as the "Christ be with Me" stanza.

This poem or lyric is in iambic pentameter with four feet per line (de-um, de-um, de-um, de-dum). Often at the end of the last line there is an extra unstressed beat (de-dum-de).

I do not think a summary of I Bind Unto Myself Today (Saint Patrick's Breastplate) would do it justice. I do, however recommend you look it up – in the hymnal or online. Note the scope of subjects brought up and how they all fit together with each other, Christ's work, and the Trinity in our Christian life. It can also be helpful to see what the focus of the poem is about and what each stanza is about. The focus of the poem is taking on God and his good for Christian life and work, even battle. There are eight stanzas. The first and the last focus on the Trinity. In between these bookends, the stanzas cover the work of Christ, God's creation, the power of God, two stanzas increasing an emphasis as to the threats to be resisted, and an interlude of sorts about Christ. Again, it concludes with the Trinity; this time in more detail. The best way to understand a poem is to read it and reread it with enjoyment.

MARCH LOVE OFFERING

The Cathy Mabry Cloninger Center ~ A Domestic Violence Shelter

Our love offering for March will be sent to The Cathy Mabry Cloninger Center/A Domestic Violence Shelter. The Shelter operates under the direction of the Gaston County Department of Health and Human Resources and has been in operation since April 1982. The Home serves as a temporary shelter for clients to work on goals to establish new housing, jobs, daycare, etc. while providing a safe, emergency residence where victims can live in times of crisis. Other services provided include counseling, court advocacy, and support group meetings for women and a children's programs. When the families leave, the staff wants them to be strong, hopeful for the future and know that there is always someone only a phone call away if help is needed.

Domestic violence statistics continue to rise; therefore it is so important for each of us to take a stand against this deadly and violent problem affecting many innocent women and children. In the United States, a woman is assaulted every nine seconds. We can all play a role in stopping violence and creating a safe environment for people to live and work.

Also, the Shelter is now part of Gaston County's Hope United Survivor Network Family, as well as Gaston County's Family Justice Center and The Lighthouse Children's Advocacy Center. Hope United serves survivors of domestic violence, sexual assault, elder abuse, child abuse and human trafficking. Survivors can access many different legal services on site such as court orders and counseling. Working together, these ministries can help survivors begin their journey towards safety, healing, and hope.

The Shelter depends on donations from private citizens, public and private organizations, local industries, and religious groups throughout the county. Please prayerfully consider giving a donation to this ministry and help to make a difference.
