Easter is not just a day but a fifty day season. It is the Feast of Feasts and lasts seven weeks. You may note the Bible is replete with "seven" as a symbolical number representing wholeness and completion.

So how do you feast for fifty days? I mean how do you balance a faithful feasting and celebrating without becoming unhealthy? Isn't it strange how virtues and vices may tumble into one another? I love apple pie. Too much apple pie is bad for me. But the right taste, right time, right is just so right! In excess, the wrong act, the wrong time, wrong is just so wrong! Make sense? Please share some ways you keep the feast in 2024.

Consider the resurrection hope. The One who began life at the very first and gives us our very existence, who sustains us heartbeat by heartbeat, this One has been made known to us and the whole world in Jesus the Christ. Jesus alone is the way, the truth, and the life – eternal life, resurrection life, and He calls all of us to hear and believe. What will the resurrection of the body be like? Early Christians pointed to the caterpillar becoming the butterfly. It is hard to accept that I am a caterpillar! I am not what I should be. My understanding, my reason is limited. My capacity, my personhood is in flux. Yet God is calling us forward to become what He wills for us ultimately to be as His children now and forever.

Christ is risen! He is risen indeed!...O Death, where is your sting? O Hell, where is your victory? Christ is risen and you are overthrown. Christ is risen, and the demons are fallen. Christ is risen, and the Angels rejoice. **Christ is risen, and life reigns.** Christ is risen, and not one dead remains in the grave. For Christ, being risen from the dead, has become the first fruits of those who have fallen asleen. To Him be glory and

first fruits of those who have fallen asleep. To Him be glory and dominion unto ages of ages. Amen (**Paschal Sermon**, St. John Chrysostom).

Let us keep these 50 Days from Easter Day to Holy Humor Sunday to Ascension Day and culminating with Pentecost this May 19. Celebrate!

LUTHERAN CHAPEL **CONGREGATIONAL COUNCIL MINUTES**

March 17, 2024

Council made decisions and discussed the following:

- A financial report was presented and overall Lutheran Chapel is in good shape and in the black.
- Courtyard beautification project will begin April 1, 2024. Pavers have been ordered to represent donations and memorial gifts.
- Crown will do a temple talk on Palm Sunday regarding Juan's status. If anyone has questions, they should contact Jason Sanders.
- Kathy Riebe had been given permission by the executive committee to ask Jeannette Myers to fill in on the piano for choir rehearsal and anthems. Jeanette will fill in temporarily.
- A new organist search committee was formed and includes Crown Hoffman as chair, Seth Myers, Mark Thornburg, and Debra Hoffman as secretary only.
- New Administrative Assistant, Rebecca Shaw, has been hired as of April 1. She will be shadowing Kim for training. Kim has agreed to come back in April to train her.
- Pastor Michael reported that the Seminary in Columbia, SC is moving to Lenoir Rhyne College by January 2025. Pastor reviewed the year for 2023. He also advised that Novus Way, the camps at Luther Ridge, Luther Ranch, Luther Rock, and Luther Springs is struggling with a million plus dept. Radical restricting of the budget and selling land from sites such as Luther Ranch in Georgia.
- The next clothing giveaway is scheduled for April 13. ٠
- The Security Committee has put a new MVR in place and signs are being put out about the security.
- The Property Committee reported that the beautification project has started. The work on the flat roof has been completed. A handrail was put in the stairwell on the choir side. Max Baxter will be installing rain guards around the family life center.

The next full council meeting is scheduled for May 19, 2024 at noon.

CAM Food Drive



APRIL ~ Lutheran Services Carolinas

Our love offering ministry for April will be Lutheran Services Carolinas. Lutheran Services is an agency of the North and South Carolina Synods of the Evangelical Lutheran Church in America and is one of the largest non-profit child and family service agency in the Carolinas, serving thousands of people annually through the following services:

- Adoption regular and special needs
- Adult Residential Services
- Child and Youth Residential Services
- Disaster preparedness and response
- Family and individual counseling
- Foster care family, therapeutic and medically fragile
- Homelessness prevention
- Refugee and resettlement and immigration
- Veterans' services

Love Offering

LSC serves in **Gaston County** through foster care, services to people with developmental disabilities, its partnership in Senior TLC program and Dallas High School Apartments.

- Lutheran Services Carolinas has purchased the Dallas High School Apartments which provide lowincome Gaston citizens with a nice, comfortable, safe place to live.
- LSC is a founding partner of the Senior TLC Program for All-Inclusive Care for the Elderly (PACE) which serves Gaston, Cleveland, and Lincoln counties. PACE is a Medicare program and Medicaid option for North Carolinians who need skilled nursing but wish to stay in their own home.
- Mountain Ridge group home in Gastonia provides a safe home for six adults with developmental disabilities.

Lutheran Services Carolinas works in partnership with congregations, governmental agencies, and other human service providers to promote healing and wholeness for the Carolinas' most vulnerable people.

Please consider contributing a love offering to support Lutheran Services Carolinas so that they may continue their ministry and strengthen their outreach to people in need.

MAY ~ Habitat for Humanity

Our love offering for May will be sent to Habitat for Humanity of Gaston County. Habitat for Humanity is a non-profit Christian based ministry dedicated to eliminating substandard housing. Funds for the construction of homes are obtained through financial contributions from individuals, churches, and businesses. The homes are sold to qualified families at no profit and financed with affordable, no-interest mortgages repaid over 20 years. Mortgage money is then recycled back to build more homes for families in need. Habitat is not a give-away program. Habitat relies heavily on volunteers for construction in all homes. The work is a cooperative effort between volunteers and new home buyers who contribute labor to build their homes.

To date, Habitat for Humanity of Gaston has built more than 126 homes in Gaston and is currently building in a neighborhood in North Belmont on donated land. To date, six Habitat homes have been completed in Dixon Village, with families occupying three homes. Habitat for Humanity also has a home repair program.

Please prayerfully consider giving to this ministry so that Habitat will continue to grow and help even more families so they will have the opportunity to become a homeowner.
