

STORY OF SALVATION LESSON

RUTH 1:1-17

Ruth along with the rest of the Moabites and other –ite people are supposed to be wiped out since the Conquest. Yet here the faith of Ruth in the LORD and her mother-in-law builds the foundation for the coming King.

¹In the days when the judges ruled, there was a famine in the land, and a certain man of Bethlehem in Judah went to live in the country of Moab, he and his wife and two sons. ²The name of the man was Elimelech and the name of his wife Naomi, and the names of his two sons were Mahlon and Chilion; they were Ephrathites from Bethlehem in Judah. They went into the country of Moab and remained there. ³But Elimelech, the husband of Naomi, died, and she was left with her two sons. ⁴These took Moabite wives; the name of the one was Orpah and the name of the other Ruth. When they had lived there about ten years, ⁵both Mahlon and Chilion also died, so that the woman was left without her two sons and her husband. ⁶Then she started to return with her daughters-in-law from the country of Moab, for she had heard in the country of Moab that the LORD had considered his people and given them food. ⁷So she set out from the place where she had been living, she and her two daughters-inlaw, and they went on their way to go back to the land of Judah. ⁸But Naomi said to her two daughters-in-law, "Go back each of you to your mother's house. May the LORD deal kindly with you, as you have dealt with the dead and with me. ⁹The LORD grant that you may find security, each of you in the house of your husband." Then she kissed them, and they wept aloud. ¹⁰They said to her, "No, we will return with you to your people." ¹¹But Naomi said, "Turn back, my daughters, why will you go with me? Do I still have sons in my womb that they may become your husbands? ¹²Turn back, my daughters, go your way, for I am too old to have a husband. Even if I thought there was hope for me, even if I should have a husband tonight and bear sons, ¹³would you then wait until they were grown? Would you then refrain from marrying? No, my daughters, it has been far more bitter for me than for you, because the hand of the LORD has turned against me." ¹⁴Then they wept aloud again. Orpah kissed her mother-in -law, but Ruth clung to her.

¹⁵So she said, "See, your sister-in-law has gone back to her people and to her gods; return after your sister-in-law." ¹⁶But Ruth said,


"Do not press me to leave you or to turn back from following you! Where you go, I will go; where you lodge, I will lodge, your people shall be my people, and your God my God. ¹⁷Where you die, I will die there will I be buried. May the LORD do thus and so to me, and more as well, if even death parts me from you!"

SECOND LESSON

The opening of this letter serves as a reality check. The reality of God is light, but our confessed reality has been sin. God cleanses us from our sinful reality through Christ's death so that we live in fellowship with Christ and walk in God's light.

¹We declare to you what was from the beginning, what we have heard, what we have seen with our eyes, what we have looked at and touched with our hands, concerning the word of life— ²this life was revealed, and we have seen it and testify to it, and declare to you the eternal life that was with the Father and was revealed to us—³we declare to you what we have seen and heard so that you also may have fellowship with us; and truly our fellowship is with the Father and with his Son Jesus Christ. ⁴We are writing these things so that our joy may be complete.

⁵This is the message we have heard from him and proclaim to you, that God is light and in him there is no darkness at all. ⁶If we say that we have fellowship with him while we are walking in darkness, we lie and do not do what is true; ⁷but if we walk in the light as he himself is in the light, we have fellowship with one another, and the blood of Jesus his Son cleanses us from all sin. ⁸If we say that we have no sin, we deceive ourselves, and the truth is not in us. ⁹If



we confess our sins, he who is faithful and just will forgive us our sins and cleanse us from all unrighteousness. ¹⁰If we say that we have not sinned, we make him a liar, and his word is not in us.

^{2:1}My little children, I am writing these things to you so that you may not sin. But if anyone does sin, we have an advocate with the Father, Jesus Christ the righteous; ²and he is the atoning sacrifice for our sins, and not for ours only but also for the sins of the whole world.

The story of Easter continues as the risen Jesus appears to his disciples. His words to Thomas offer a blessing to all who entrust themselves in faith to the risen Lord.

¹⁹When it was evening on that day, the first day of the week, and the doors of the house where the disciples had met were locked for fear of the Jews, Jesus came and stood among them and said, "Peace be with you." ²⁰After he said this, he showed them his hands and his side. Then the disciples rejoiced when they saw the Lord. ²¹Jesus said to them again, "Peace be with you. As the Father has sent me, so I send you." ²²When he had said this, he breathed on them and said to them, "Receive the Holy Spirit. ²³If you forgive the sins of any, they are forgiven them; if you retain the sins of any, they are retained."

²⁴But Thomas (who was called the Twin), one of the twelve, was not with them when Jesus came. ²⁵So the other disciples told him, "We have seen the Lord." But he said to them, "Unless I see the mark of the nails in his hands, and put my finger in the mark of the nails and my hand in his side, I will not believe."

²⁶A week later his disciples were again in the house, and Thomas was with them. Although the doors were shut, Jesus came and stood among them and said, "Peace be with you." ²⁷Then he said to Thomas, "Put your finger here and see my hands. Reach out your hand and put it in my side. Do not doubt but believe." ²⁸Thomas answered him, "My Lord and my God!" ²⁹Jesus said to him, "Have you believed because you have seen me? Blessed are those who have not seen and yet have come to believe."

³⁰Now Jesus did many other signs in the presence of his disciples, which are not written in this book. ³¹But these are written so that you may come to believe that Jesus is the Messiah, the Son of God, and that through believing you may have life in his name.

Please take your communion cup as you leave and discard in trashcan.





Excursus: On the Judges

The period of the Judges (approximately 1400 to 1000 BC) was a time of struggle. The conquest of Canaan, accomplished largely in the days of Joshua, began to fall apart. The temptations of Canaanite tribes, intermarriage, and false gods led the twelve tribes of Israel astray leading to a cycle of fall into mess, oppression, and eventual deliverance through the various judges the LORD lifted up. Judges such as Deborah, Gideon, Samson, and others were fill by the "Spirit of the LORD" (re: Judges 14:6) to save Israel. The period ends with a horrific civil war between the tribes of Israel almost wiping out the tribe of Benjamin (Judges 19-21). The book of Ruth is a powerful story of both loss and faithful perseverance set in this period. The last judge, Samuel, sets the stage for the time of the Kings and Prophets.

Journey of Samuel, Judge and Prophet

Call of the LORD

Samuel, last of the Old Testament judges and first of the prophets after Moses, lived during the 11th century B.C. The child of Elkanah, an Ephraimite, and his wife Hannah, Samuel was from early on consecrated by his parents for sacred service and trained in the house of the Lord at Shiloh by Eli the priest. His mother sang the Song of Hannah giving thanks for his birth (1 Samuel 2). Samuel's authority as a prophet was established by God (1 Samuel 3:20). As a youth, Samuel was given the difficult call to rebuke Eli and the abuses done by his sons against their people (1 Samuel 3:10-14).

Ebenezer - Thus Far the LORD Has Helped Us

The Philistines continue to go in power. In a catastrophic defeat, the armies of Israel are beaten and the Ark of the Covenant is taken away. Over a course of seven months, the LORD afflicts the Philistines with plagues and desecration of their idol Dagon (1 Samuel 5-6). Eventually the Philistines put the Ark out of their territories. Samuel prayed to the LORD for strength to defeat the Philistines and won a great victory. The Ebenezer stone was erected as a remembrance of this. Samuel kept a circuit of visits throughout the tribes as he judged the tribes and lived in Ramah. Yet his sons, Joel and Abijah, did not follow in their father's faithfulness and instead took bribes and perverted justice (! Samuel 8:1-3).

Anointing of Kings

This led to Israel's desire for a king. Samuel argued mightily against this insisting the LORD alone is the true King (1 Samuel 8 and 12). He relented when the LORD called him to anoint Saul as the first King of United Israel (1 Samuel 10:1). Sadly, as a result of Saul's disobedience to God, Samuel ended up repudiating Saul's leadership. The LORD called Saul to anoint the boy David to eventually be king in place of Saul (16:13).

Death and Legacy

The death of Samuel is reported at 1 Samuel 25:1. Then there is a mysterious appearance of Samuel after his death when he comes to King Saul and the Witch of Endor and announces the coming death of the King (1 Samuel 28). Samuel's loyalty to God, his spiritual insight, and his ability to inspire others made him one of Israel's great leaders. The commemoration day (heavenly birthday) for Samuel in Lutheran and Orthodox churches is on August 20.

So What? Plain Sense Stuff: The truth will set you free (John 8:32). It may not make you popular or win worldly support but truth telling set Samuel free when he honestly rebuked Eli and his family, his own adult sons, and even King Saul. Samuel put God's call first in his life, then his country, family, etc. Samuel speaking after death is a strange story that reminds us of the mystery of life after death. Samuel's humility led him to anoint kings even though he thought the monarchy was wrong for his nation.
