STORY OF SALVATION LESSON

GENESIS 3:1-7, 14-24

Now the serpent was more crafty than any other wild animal that the LORD God had made. He said to the woman, "Did God say, 'You shall not eat from any tree in the garden'?" ²The woman said to the serpent, "We may eat of the fruit of the trees in the garden; ³but God said, 'You shall not eat of the fruit of the tree that is in the middle of the garden, nor shall you touch it, or you shall die." ⁴But the serpent said to the woman, "You will not die; ⁵for God knows that when you eat of it your eyes will be opened, and you will be like God, knowing good and evil." ⁶So when the woman saw that the tree was good for food, and that it was a delight to the eyes, and that the tree was to be desired to make one wise, she took of its fruit and ate; and she also gave some to her husband, who was with her, and he ate. ⁷Then the eyes of both were opened, and they knew that they were naked; and they sewed fig leaves together and made loincloths for themselves.

¹⁴The Lord GOD said to the serpent,

"Because you have done this, cursed are you among all animals and among all wild creatures; upon your belly you shall go, and dust you shall eat all the days of your life.

¹⁵I will put enmity between you and the woman, and between your offspring and hers; he will strike your head, and you will strike his heel."

"I will greatly increase your pangs in childbearing; in pain you shall bring forth children,

yet your desire shall be for your husband, and he shall rule over you."

"Because you have listened to the voice of your wife,

'You shall not eat of it,'

cursed is the ground because of you;

in toil you shall eat of it all the days of your life;

¹⁸thorns and thistles it shall bring forth for you;

and you shall eat the plants of the field.

¹⁹By the sweat of your face

you shall eat bread

until you return to the ground,

for out of it you were taken;

you are dust,

and to dust you shall return."

²⁰The man named his wife Eve, because she was the mother of all living. ²¹And the Lord GOD

made garments of skins for the man and for his wife, and clothed them.

²²Then the Lord GOD said, "See, the man has become like one of us, knowing good and evil; and now, he might reach out his hand and take also from the tree of life, and eat, and live forever" — ²³therefore the Lord GOD sent him forth from the garden of Eden, to till the ground from which he was taken. ²⁴He drove out the man; and at the east of the garden of Eden he placed the cherubim, and a sword flaming and turning to guard the way to the tree of life.



MESSAGE

"The Example of Gift and Baptism"

On Genesis 3 What is Sin? What is our Human Condition? The Example and Command of Jesus for Baptism

The Law is an aspect in the Word that shows our brokenness, sin and need for Jesus's aving power: Do I live out of the gift of my baptism in the Name of the Father, + Son, and Holy Spirit? Or do I live out of self-centeredness and self-preoccupation?

The Gospel is an aspect in the Word that gives strength, wisdom and hope in Jesus' ultimate saving power: Jesus receives baptism as an example for us and gives the gift of baptism that we may live in the Father, + Son, and Holy Spirit day by day, now to forever.

So What? Whenever you wash your face, remember your baptism (Martin Luther). Before you work, before you pray – do all to the glory of God and not for vanities. Invite any who has not received the gift of baptism to receive it – let each one of us reach another in 2025.




