THE BIBLE IN A YEAR DISCIPLINE



One can come to every Sunday Service, to little church on Wednesdays, and to study at Sunday School and still not get through the entire Bible. One way to keep such a discipline is the Bible in a Year discipline, which we use from Our Daily Bread and that is reprinted in the weekly bulletin Sunday by Sunday. As Lutheran Christians, we believe, teach and confess that the Word of God is given us here and that the Holy Spirit uses the Word to create faith and grow us in Christ. Claim this gift for yourself regularly in 2025!

From keeping this discipline, I offer some insights from my reading. Name this patriarch. Parental favoritism (Genesis 25:28). Death threats (Genesis 27:42). Marriage to two sisters

(Genesis 29:21-30). Wrestling God (Genesis 32:28). Rape of his daughter (Genesis 34:1-4). Incest mess (Genesis 35:22). Giver of the coat of many colors (Genesis 37). Loss of sons – at least he thought so (Genesis 42:36). Famine mess (Genesis 42:1-2). Refugee in Egypt (Genesis 46:1-4). The answer is (hope you have read this far!) – the Patriarch Jacob, renamed by God to be Israel.

Why does the Holy Spirit preserve this story of Israel's family trouble for us? What does it say to you contemplating all these twists and turns? Do you see the tensions that Luther succinctly called "saint

and sinner at the same time" here? Maybe one of the big lessons – where is forgiveness in this story (Genesis 49-50)?

I love the quote attributed to Corrie Ten Boom: "Forgiveness is releasing the prisoner and realizing that the prisoner was you."

May our Father in Heaven bless our listening to the Word given us and especially this Bible in a Year discipline.

JANUARY CONGREGATIONAL COUNCIL MINUTES

- Approval was received from the council to accept Sudonna McManus Handy into membership.
- The 25-year celebration and recognition of Mrs. Janet McKinney's Preschool Leadership was discussed. No date has been set yet. The plan is for recognition during the service, a reception after the service, and to invite the preschool parents and children to the service and reception.
- The future use of the sanctuary basement was discussed. Peery provided an update on the repairs and the property committee's work to date, identifying and resolving the sources of the water leaks during heavy rainfall.
- Incineration of wet records has been completed. New storage shelves and undamaged paper records are now
 located in the sanctuary basement. The council recommended locking the records room door. Seth
 recommended consideration of a third-party shred vendor where shred bins are secured (only accessible by
 the vendor) and contents are shredded periodically. James referenced the IRS' requirement for a written
 security plan that LCC should proactively consider that includes actions for handling an information breach.
- The future use of the Robinson endowment was brought up. The Endowment funds were used in the past for Lutheridge camp scholarships and other youth trips. David and Matt expressed an interest in working with the appropriate committee on the topic of engaging more youth in current and future activities.
- The Carbonite computer backup contract renews in January. Deborah obtained pricing information for a bare metal backup option. The cost would be between \$288 to \$559. The council agreed to stay with the data-only backup option.
- The 2025 Church Directory update was discussed including interest in including pictures in the next update. The last picture directory was published in 2019.
- Mark McCauley has served updating the LCC website for many years and has requested to be replaced. Drew Carpenter, Katherine Sanders and Debbie Jean Wankel have volunteered.
- Rob reported that the center arch appears to be sinking near the FLC entrance. This was observed when they salted entrances last Sunday.
- A security incident was reported on the clothing donation's side porch. Camera surveillance caught an
 individual pushing bags of clothing through the window screen (damaging the screen) and fleeing to the
 woods. There have been 2 -3 events within the past year of vandalism or trespassing (individuals sleeping on
 the side porch). The council discussed potential actions that may prevent property damage and increase
 safety for church staff and preschool.

The season of Lent begins on **Ash Wednesday, March 5th**. Worship Service will be held in the Sanctuary at 7:00 pm with Imposition of Ashes and Holy Communion.

A Taizé Prayer Service, offering time for meditation together, will be offered each Wednesday at 7:00 pm in the Sanctuary.




SHROVE TUESDAY

The Social Ministry Committee would like to sincerely thank everyone for your many gifts over the last few months. During the Thanksgiving holidays, we as a church family made a real difference in the lives of many families. Your generosity is overwhelming. Because of your generous donations, we were able to provide 127 families with a \$25.00 gift card through the schools. A note was placed with each gift card with a Thanksgiving prayer. What a blessing to these families as we all struggle during this time.

This year, our church family filled 84 Samaritan's Purse Christmas shoeboxes. The gift of each shoebox is an opportunity to share the true meaning of Christmas with children in desperate situations around the world. The gifts you pack into each box bring smiles to children; while also sharing the opportunity through children's literature about God's greatest gift, His Son, Jesus Christ.


We are also continuing to purchase food items for the Salvation Army food pantry. Families may go to the Center of Hope on Broad Street for food, clothes and assistance with jobs and housing. A member of our church obtained funds of \$250 to be used for food for the Salvation Army. So, in addition to food, we were able to purchase 45 pairs of socks, 24 beanies or toboggans, and 40 blankets to be given to the homeless.

To help our neighbors in need, a donation \$10,345 was given from our congregation to Samaritan's Purse to help families in our North Carolina mountains rebuild their lives after Hurricane Helene. Please continue to pray and support or neighbors.

In addition to our Outreach committee's helping the Bessemer City Boys and Girls Club, a member of our congregation raised \$1,600 from friends and family to provide Christmas for 8 children that were brought to his attention through a member of our church.

Our church family touches many lives through the gifts of ministries from the different committees in our church. Through these gifts, needs are met and hopefully, the people know that they are loved and cared for. We pray that we are making a difference in the lives of our neighbors as we share God's love and blessings - whether it be a Thanks-giving meal, a daily meal for families, or a Christmas shoebox for a child.

LOVE OFFERING FOR FEBRUARY

The love offering for February will go to the Backpack Weekend Food Program. For the past 13 years Lutheran Chapel Church along with other partners have helped the BWFP provide more than 2 million meals to needy students in Gaston County. Recent studies indicate nearly 31 percent of children in Gaston County live in low income households with nearly 16 percent of children in our county living in households without a reliable source of food to eat. At the present we at Lutheran Chapel are providing food for 10 children at Robinson Elementary and 3 children at Hawks Nest. We supply this food for \$341 per child per school year.
