P: If we say we have no sin, we deceive ourselves, and the truth is not in us. But if we confess our sins, God who is faithful and just will forgive our sins and cleanse us from all unrighteousness. THE TEN COMMANDMENTS

Am I a wise manager for God in taking care of all with which He blesses me? You shall not bear false witness against your neighbor. Seek and speak truth always. Do I use meanness in my speech? You shall not covet your neighbor's house. Choose contentment with your stuff. Do I avoid coveting things? You shall not covet your neighbor's husband (or wife). Cherish your relationships daily. Do I avoid coveting relationships?




