ON LOVING GOD

Friends in Christ,

Sunday by Sunday we recite and reflect on the Great Commandment of our Lord Jesus to "love the Lord your God with all your heart, all your soul, all your mind, and all your strength and love your neighbor as yourself" (Mark 12:28-31). There is spiritual benefit as we repeat the gift of God's Word and I hope the Holy Spirit will grow each of us through this regular contemplation.

Summer reading to pass along on this very subject comes from St. Bernard of Clairvaux. He is a great writer from our Christian tradition and a huge influence on

Martin Luther. Some quotes from his **On Loving God** to consider for your journey are below:

- The reason for loving God is God Himself. There is only one measure for how He is to be loved: it is immeasurable!
- Rest in Him alone. Man knowns no peace in the world, but he has no disturbance when he is with God.
- We must know, then, what we are, and that it is not of ourselves that we are. Unless we know this thoroughly, either we shall not glory at all, or our glorying will be in vain.
- Real happiness will come not in gratifying our desires or in gaining transient pleasures, but in accomplishing God's will for us, even as we pray every day: Thy will be done.

If you have any quotable quotes to share from summer reading please pass them along. I am still wrestling with **Live Not By Lies** by Rod Dreher – the title is actually a quote by Aleksandr Solzhenitsyn. Thanks be to God for the gift of reading, listening, and exploring new ideas all through the journey of life. What kind of explorations will we have in eternal life to come?

Financial Report

While LCC is currently below projected contributions, this is offset by lower-than-budgeted distributions and expenses. Rob Andrews requested historical data on annual donations and monthly variances from projected contributions to help determine the appropriate timing for a potential temple talk with the congregation.

Pastor's Report

- Andy Royston would like to join LCC. He has completed catechism with the Pastor.
- After discussion, it was decided to move forward with a monthly Catechism study for all interested. This will be begin in September.

Old Business

- The church van had some minor repairs and detailing done in early July. Big thanks to Steve Clark!
- Thanks to Debra for consolidating all the music in the Educational Building.
- Pickup basketball will take place on Thursdays in the Family Life Center from 6-8 pm.
- Hickory Crawdad's baseball outing was on Tuesday, July 22. Thanks to David Zibell for coordinating this
 fun event.
- Seth is coordinating a 25th Anniversary celebration for Janet McKinney for the fall.

COUNCIL MINUTES continued

New Business

- The idea was brought to the Council to add an Activities Director Role. This position would plan and coordinate church activities for our youth and adults. It was voted that we move forward with the hire.
- Changes to the worship schedule were discussed, including changing to:
 8:30 am Morning Prayer, 9:30 am Bible Study/Sunday School and 10:30 am Service, or
 8:00 am service 9:00 am Bible Study/Sunday School and 10:00 am Service.
 Jason and Matt suggested that we do a mailing to measure the preferences of the congregation. Jason Sanders will handle the survey write-up with QR code.
- Rob Andrews addressed concerns with the committee bylaws. Changes suggested include:
 - 1. Adding the committee bylaws as an addendum to the church bylaws.
 - 2. Stating the committee's mission, purpose, and succession rules.
 - 3. Adding a term limit to committee chairs

These ideas will be brought before the church council for approval to make sure they align with LCC bylaws.



CRISIS ASSISTANCE MINISTRY

Our love offering for August will be for Crisis Assistance Ministry. This ministry would not be possible without the financial gifts, food donations, and volunteer hours that 48 congregations in our county provide. The participation of our congregation is essential to ensure that CAM has an adequate food supply and enough money to meet the requests for assistance that they receive. Assistance to more than 3,200 families was provided last year - 2,005 food orders and \$198,000.00 to direct client assistance for rent, utilities and mortgage.

Please continue to place food donations in the blue box in our Sunday School wing and in the basket in the narthex of the sanctuary. Please check the expiration dates of all donated food items. Last year, our generous church family donated 188 bags of food. The Social Ministry Committee will continue to deliver to CAM as donations are given.

It is vital to our community of neighbors who suffer under the burden of poverty and for those in financial crisis that we continue to support this ministry. Just this year, CAM has received 170 applications for assistance. CAM is continually tweaking its programs to improve the way that the needs of our community are met. The fact that CAM is very successful in meeting the needs of families and individuals is the very reason we need to continue to support them.

Please prayerfully consider your donation and help CAM to meet the essential life needs of food, rent/mortgage, utilities, and prescription medicines of people in need. Our congregation is always very generous each month to our love offerings, and we appreciate the support and love that you give to ministries as they work to stop the suffering of our neighbors.



SERIES ON THE HOLY COMMUNION SERVICE


Why do we pray this almost every Sunday Service?

The Lutheran Confessions assert that "the chief Service of God is to preach the Gospel" (**Apology of the Augsburg Confession**, 15:42). So, where is the good news in the Service millennia by millennia, Sunday by Sunday? Consider this little commentary on the Holy Communion Service. If the Holy Spirit has passed these scriptures and songs down to us, then maybe they are worth putting in our hearts, right?




The Lord Have Mercy (Kyrie Eleison) – This is the cry of blind Bartimaeus and the lepers in distress (Mark 10:47 and Luke 17:12-13). We cry to God in Jesus' Name and He will hear us (John 14:13-14). This ancient prayer recognizes that our human condition is entirely contingent and dependent on God. It is also part of daily prayers. Why? I need God's help. Don't we all?

Glory to God in the Highest (Gloria in Excelsis) – This is the song of the angels (Luke 2:14) and the confession of John the Baptist (John 1:29) combined as one of the earliest Christian songs. We can give glory to Jesus and, as the shepherds of old, we can join in the cosmic song. Rejoice!




Holy, Holy, Holy (The Sanctus) — The song of the seraphim, heard by the Prophet Isaiah at his call to serve the LORD (Isaiah 6:1-4), directs us to the One who alone is holy. As the LORD is holy, so He makes His people holy through the gift of His Word and Sacrament for us.

The Creed (Apostles' Creed) – This confession of faith in God: Father, + Son, and Holy Spirit is traditionally attributed to the Apostles. Jesus reveals the mystery of God as Trinity (Matthew 28:19-20). Let us confess our faith and invite all to worship the One, true God of all.


