" ⁹ The LORD said to Moses, "I have seen this people, how stiff-necked they are. ¹⁰ Now let me alone so that my wrath may burn hot against them and I may consume them, and of you I will make a great nation."


¹ Now all the tax collectors and sinners were coming near to listen to [Jesus.] ² And the Pharisees

MESSAGE "Lost and Found"

Sermon on the Mount Can Just One Human Being Mean So Much? YES

The Law is an aspect in the Word that shows our brokenness, sin and need for Jesus's aving power: I do not seek the lost. I do not invite. It is embarrassing to do what Jesus says and go out. The Gospel is an aspect in the Word that gives strength, wisdom and hope in Jesus'ultimate saving power: Jesus found me and sends me in His peace to go and serve the Kingdom by inviting all. So What? Consider your relationships – family, friends, co-workers, neighbors, strangers – who is God calling you to invite?


