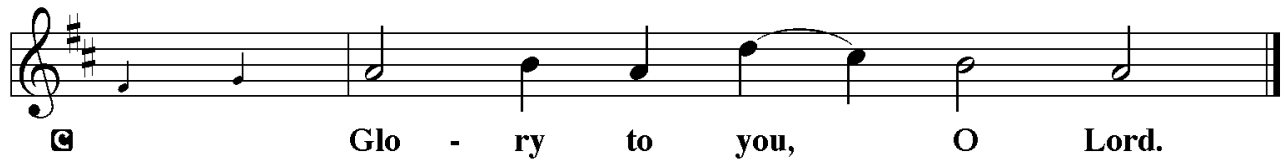

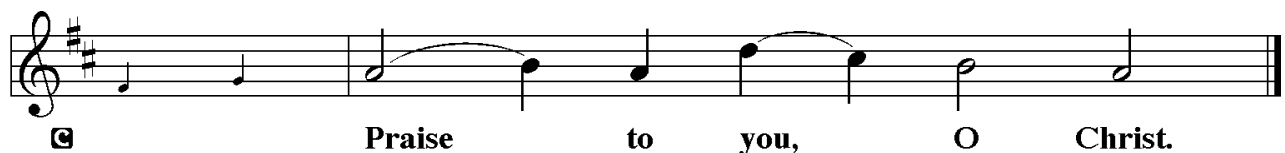

LITURGY OF REMEMBRANCE

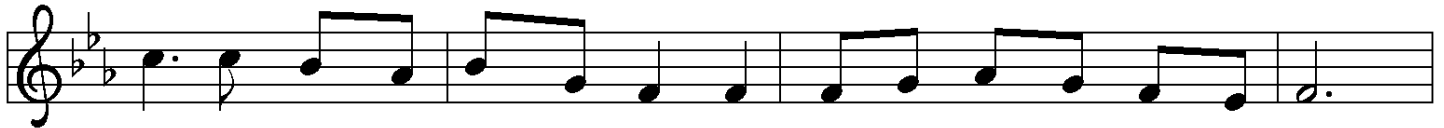
