ROMANS 7:15-25a

¹⁵ I do not understand my own actions. For I do not do what I want, but I do the very thing I hate. ¹⁶ Now if I do what I do not want, I agree that the law is good. ¹⁷ But in fact it is no longer I who do it but sin that dwells within me. ¹⁸ For I know that the good does not dwell within me, that is, in my flesh. For the desire to do the good lies close at hand, but not the ability. ¹⁹ For I do not do the good I want, but the evil I do not want is what I do. ²⁰ Now if I do what I do not want, it is no longer I who do it but sin that dwells within me.

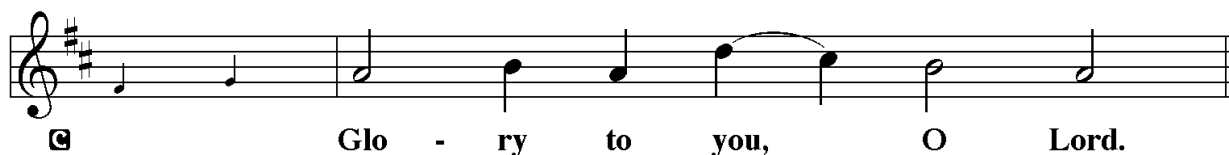

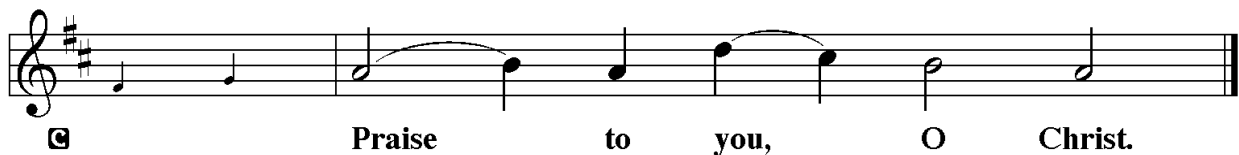

On the Prophet Zephaniah Warnings

The Law is an aspect in the Word that shows our brokenness, sin and need for Jesus’ saving power: The vanity of this world goes with might makes right and survival of the fittest rather than trusting God’s will. Why do I get caught up in worldly standards so easily?

The Gospel is an aspect in the Word that gives strength, wisdom and hope in Jesus’ ultimate saving power: Jesus reveals the coming judgments and the ultimate Last Judgement – He will put things right in a world full of wrong. Trust His timing and wisdom.

So What/Plain Sense?: What is going on in your life? Where is God in all this? What one thing did you learn from the Word of the Lord? What one question do you have from the Word of the Lord? Remember the day of judgment so that you may order the days He gives wisely.



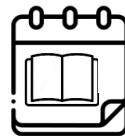

Under God's Boundless Sky


Two hundred fifty years have come and gone,

And kept the lamp lit by the open door.


"In God We Trust" is carved upon our past,
